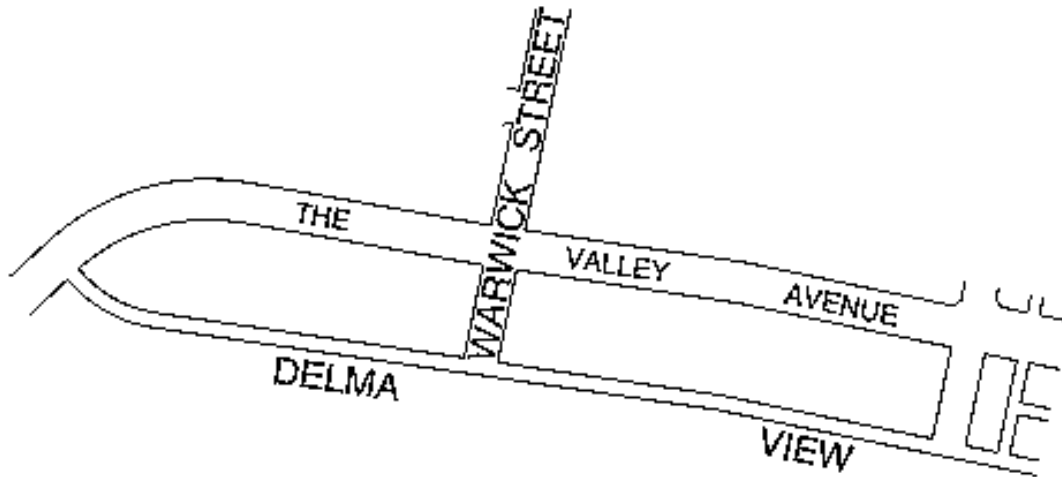

Division of Gungahlin: Early Gungahlin Pioneers, Homesteads and Sites


NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Delma View	Legless lizard of the family <i>Pygopodidae</i> , genus <i>Delma</i>	The Family <i>Pygopodidae</i> is endemic to Australia and New Guinea with closest affinities to the gecko lizards. The Striped Legless Lizard, <i>Delma impar</i> , was first described in 1882 from a specimen collected in Victoria. It is an endangered species. Its current range includes a number of areas within the Australian Capital Territory, particularly the land this street overlooks.
Warwick Street	Frederick Warwick (1857-1932)	Early Gungahlin Resident.
