NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Cecil Place	Amber Mae Cecil (1939-1998)	Australian Artist – Actor Australian radio, stage and television actor.
Dunnett Street	Frank Dunnett (1822-1891)	Australian Artist. Born in Scotland; studied under Turner before sailing to Tasmania, 1859; settled in Hobart; devoted all his spare time to painting and engraving; became first teacher of William Charles Piquenit who is regarded as the first distinguished Australian-born landscape painter.
Elischer Street	John Elischer (1891-1966)	Australian Sculptor. Born in Vienna, studied in Paris under Rodin, 1910-11; after service in World War I he freelanced as a sculptor and migrated to Australia in 1935. One of his most notable Australian works is the bust of Archbishop Mannix, modelled for Newman College, Melbourne. He was awarded the Commonwealth Jubilee prize for medal design, 1951.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Gouldsmith Street	Edmund Gouldsmith (1852-1932)	Australian Artist. Painted many views of Adelaide and Port Adelaide. His works are exhibited at the Royal Academy in London and the collection of the Art Gallery of South Australia.
Millicer Place	Mr Henry Millicer (1915-1996)	Australian Inventor of the Airtourer - a light two seater aircraft.
Simonetti Street	Achille Simonetti (1838-1900)	Australian Sculptor. Born and educated in Rome, migrated to Australia in 1871. Simonetti was the most accomplished sculptor of his time in NSW. He executed several portrait busts of prominent people and many other statues of various kinds. His works earned him several gold and silver medals and other awards. He taught at the NSW Academy of Art. Simonetti's most elaborate creation was the huge statue of Governor Phillip which stands at the entrance to Sydney's Botanic Gardens.

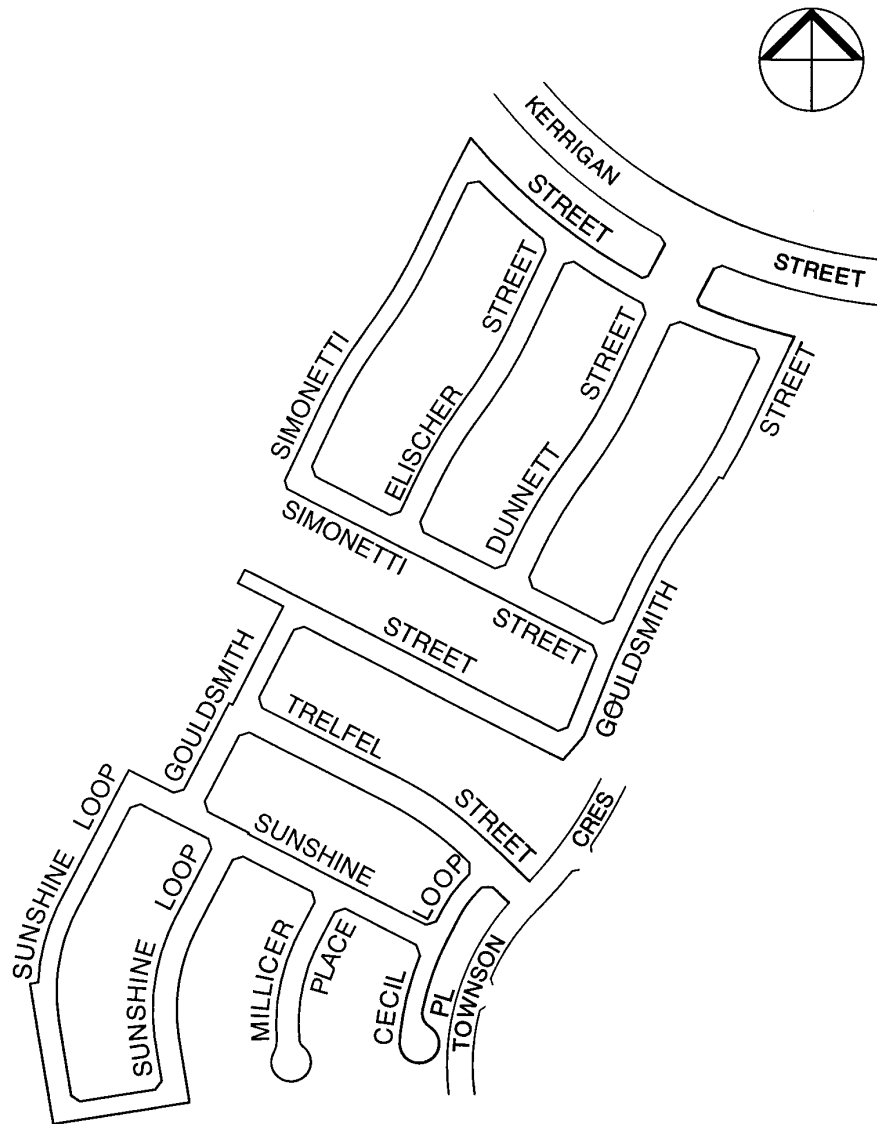

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Sunshine Loop	Sunshine Header Harvester	Australian Invention Headlie Shipard Taylor (1883-1957) invented the header harvester in 1914 and the 'Sunshine' auto-header, the first self-propelled harvester to be manufactured in large numbers, in 1924.
Trelfall Street	Sir Richard Trelfall (1861-1932)	Australian Inventor, Physicist and Chemical Engineer. Developed a precision instrument for measuring variations in gravity with J.A. Pollock KBE 1917, GBE 1927. Demonstrator, Cavendish Laboratory, Cambridge 1884-86, Professor of physics, University of Sydney 1886-98, Scientific Adviser, Albright & Wilson Co., Birmingham, England 1898-1932, Member, Board of Invention and Research, UK 1914-18. President, Section A, Australasian Association for the Advancement of Science 1890, President, Royal Society of New South Wales 1894-95. Gold medal, Society of Chemical Industry 1929.
