# ROAD TRANSPORT (PUBLIC PASSENGER SERVICES) MAXIMUM FARES FOR REGULAR ROUTE SERVICES DETERMINATION 2002

Disallowable Instrument DI 2002-67

made under the

***Road Transport (Public Passenger Services) Act 2001, s23 (Regular route services – power to determine maximum fares)***

1. **I REVOKE** determination No. 148 of 2001 dated 25 June 2001 and notified in Special Gazette No. S38 made under the *Motor Omnibus Service Act 1955* (repealed on 1 December 2001).
2. **I DETERMINE** that the maximum fares payable on regular route services provided by ACTION Authority shall be as specified in the Schedule.

**PART B: INTERPRETATION**

**Transfer (cash) ticket** – when purchased, upon boarding a regular route service, allows a person to transfer to another bus free of charge provided this occurs within 60 minutes of first validating the ticket.

**Faresaver 10 ticket** – provides 10 rides on regular route services and includes a transfer free of further charge to another bus or buses provided this occurs within 60 minutes of validating the ticket on the first bus.

**Student Faresaver 10 ticket** – provides 10 rides on regular route services within the period of a school term not including a Saturday, a Sunday or a public holiday and, for a tertiary student, within the period of the tertiary institution semester at which the student is enrolled but not including a Saturday, a Sunday or a public holiday.

Each Cash, Transfer (cash), Faresaver 10, and Student Faresaver 10 ticket applies to a journey to the terminus of the route for which the ticket was purchased.

**Daily ticket** – applies on the day when the ticket is validated and provides unlimited journeys on regular route services.

**Shoppers off-peak daily ticket** – applies on the day when the ticket is validated and provides journeys on weekdays between 9.00 am to 4.30 pm and after 6 pm, and all day Saturday, Sunday and public holidays on regular route services.

**Concession off-peak daily ticket** – applies on the day when the ticket is validated and provides unlimited journeys on weekdays between 9.00 am to 4.30 pm and after 6 pm, and all day Saturday, Sunday and public holidays on regular route services.

**Weekly ticket** – provides unlimited travel on regular route services for a period of seven (7) days commencing on the day the ticket is first validated.

**Monthly ticket** – provides unlimited travel on regular route services during a period of a month commencing on the day the ticket is first validated.

**School term ticket** – provides a student with unlimited travel within a period of a school term but not including a Saturday, a Sunday or a public holiday.

**A Concession Card Holder is:**

- (i) a person who is the holder of a card issued by Centrelink or the Department of Veterans' Affairs commonly known as a "Pensioner Concession Card", or an ACTION Concession Card issued by Centrelink based on the person holding a "Health Care Card Low Income" or a "Health Care Card" and receives one or more of the following categories of pension and allowance types:
- Age Pension
  - Bereavement Allowance
  - Carer Payment
  - Disability Support Pension
  - Mature Age Allowance
  - Mature Age Partner Allowance
  - Newstart Mature Age Allowance
  - Newstart
  - Partner Allowance
  - Parenting Payment (Single)
  - Parenting Payment (Partnered);
  - Special Benefit
  - Sickness Allowance
  - Wife Pension (age)
  - Wife Pension (Disability Support Pension)
  - Wife Pension (Disability Wage Supplement)
  - Widow Pension
  - Widow Allowance
  - Youth Allowance
- (ii) a person who holds a Department of Veterans' Affairs Gold Card

- (iii) for a concession off-peak daily ticket only – in addition to the persons at (i) and (ii) above, a senior where a person who is an ACT resident, has attained the age of 60 years and has been issued with an ACT Senior's Card.
- (iv) for a concession cash, concession transfer (cash), concession faresaver10 only – in addition to the persons at (i) and (ii) above, a primary school student and a secondary, college or full time tertiary student holding appropriate student identification.

**A Student** is a primary school student or a student who holds an appropriate student card identifying the person as:

- (i) a secondary school or college student ;
- (ii) an international student; or
- (iii) a full time tertiary student, not including a person who is a member of the Defence Force, who attends an accredited education institution and undertakes at least 15 hours per week class time.

**An Exempt Person** is:

- (i) a person who holds a Department of Veterans' Affairs Gold Card embossed with TPI or EDA and, where that person is accompanied by an attendant, the attendant;
- (ii) a World War I veteran;
- (iii) a World War I veteran's spouse, or a person who was, at the time of the veteran's death, living with the veteran as the veteran's spouse on a permanent and bona fide basis although not legally married to the veteran;
- (iv) a person wearing or displaying war service medals on the 25th day of April in any year;
- (v) a person who has been assessed as legally blind and holds an ACTION vision impaired annual ticket and where that person is accompanied by an attendant, the attendant;
- (vi) a person who has not attained the age of five years, is not occupying a seat in the bus and is in the care and custody of a person apparently over the age of eight years, who assures the driver or inspector that the first mentioned person has not attained the age of five years;
- (vii) a person who is a sworn member of the ACT Police (Australian Federal Police) and in their official capacity who holds evidence identifying him or her as such a person;
- (viii) a person employed by ACTION who is in uniform or holds written evidence, of a kind approved by the Chief Executive, ACTION identifying him or her as such a person.
