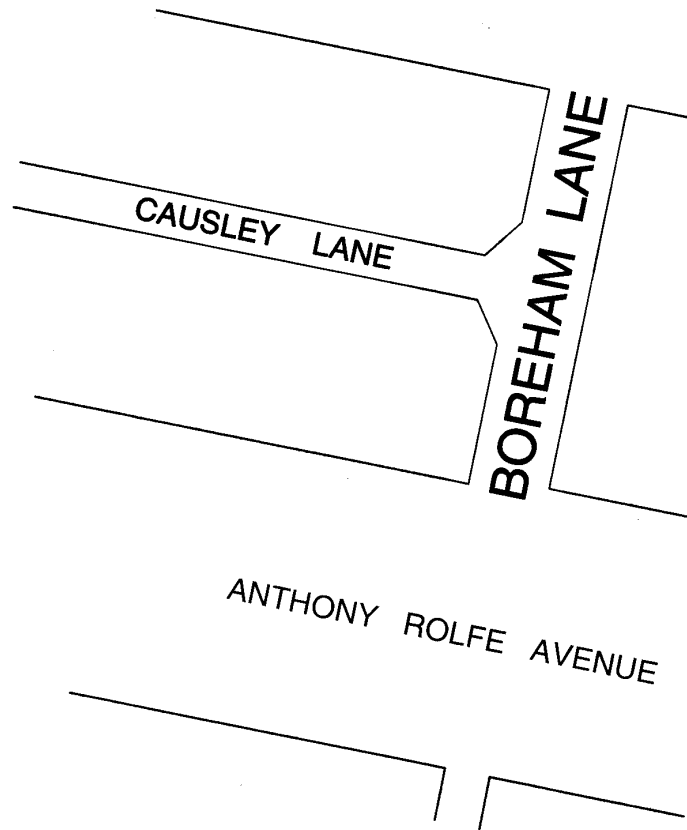
<b>NAME</b>	<b>ORIGIN</b>	<b>SIGNIFICANCE</b>
Boreham Lane	Edward Boreham (1872-1957) and Lucy Eliza Boreham (nee Cook) (-1966)	Gungahlin Pioneers  Edward Boreham (known as 'Ted') was the son of Peter and Susan Boreham of Lake Bathurst. He married Lucy Eliza Cook in 1893. They lived at 'Nine Elms' Ginninderra, the property formerly owned by Edmund Ward for many years. Ted was well known for his trotting horses.
