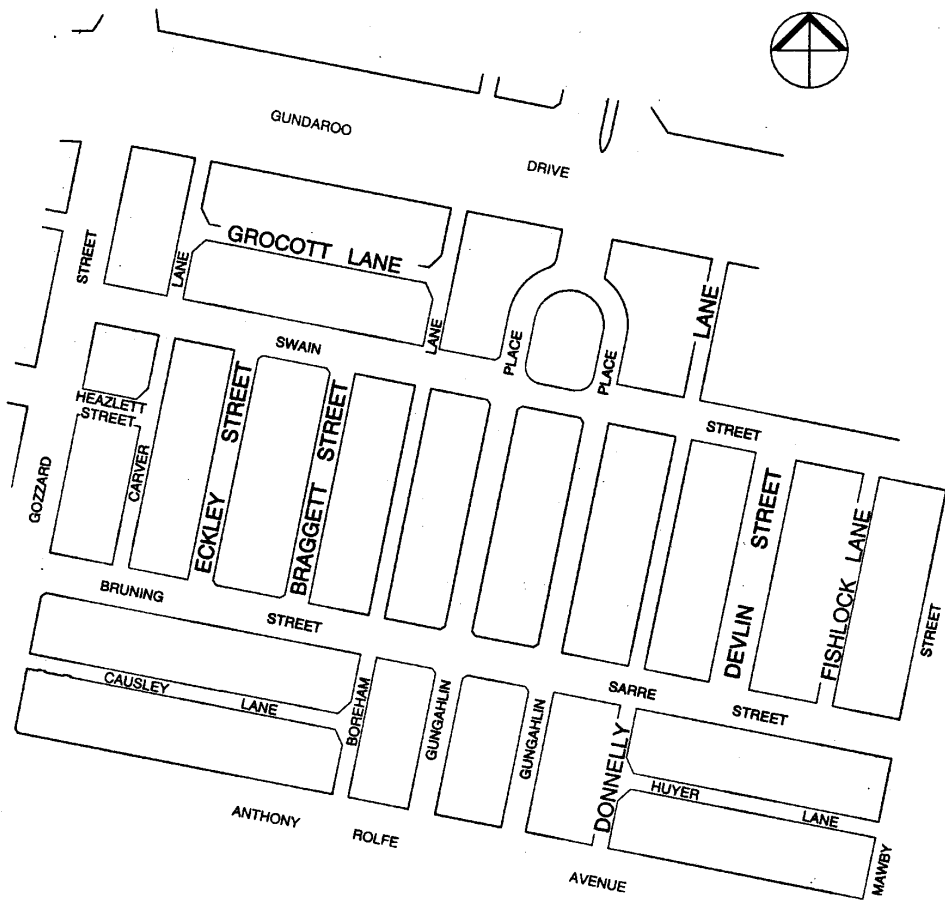

Division of Gungahlin: *Industrialists, aspects of industry and Gungahlin pioneers*

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Braggett Street	Henrietta Braggett	Gungahlin Pioneer Henrietta Braggett was a teacher at Weetangera School from 1889 to 1890.
Devlin Street	John Joseph Devlin	Gungahlin Pioneer John Joseph Devlin was a teacher at Bedellick and Jeir Half-Time Schools in 1878.
Donnelly Lane	Christopher Donnelly (1846-1911) and Mary Donnelly <i>nee</i> McDonald (d.1918)	Gungahlin Pioneers Christopher Donnelly was born in 1846, the son of William Donnelly and Mary Mehegan. He married Mary McDonald, daughter of Alexander and Catherine McDonald in 1867. They resided in the Weetangera area for many years. They had two children: Jack and Clyde (Micky). Christopher was accidently killed in Queanbeyan in 1911.
Eckley Street	Herbert Sydney Crompton Eckley	Gungahlin Pioneer Herbert Eckley was Postmaster at Ginninderra from 1886 to 1887.
Fishlock Lane	Thomas Fishlock (d.1880)	Gungahlin Pioneer Thomas Fishlock arrived in the Colony on the convict ship <i>Planter</i> on 10 October 1832. He was employed by Robert Campbell. He resided at 'Charnwood' in 1848 and was later employed as a boundary rider at Cuppacumbalong where he died in 1880.
Grocott Lane	Robert Grocott (1795-1874) and Hannah Maria Grocott <i>nee</i> Holligan (1786-1877)	Gungahlin Pioneers Robert Grocott and Hannah Maria Grocott <i>nee</i> Holligan were early pioneers of the Ginninderra district. Robert was a gardener at 'Charnwood'. They are buried in the St Paul's Cemetery, The Glebe, Ginninderra.
