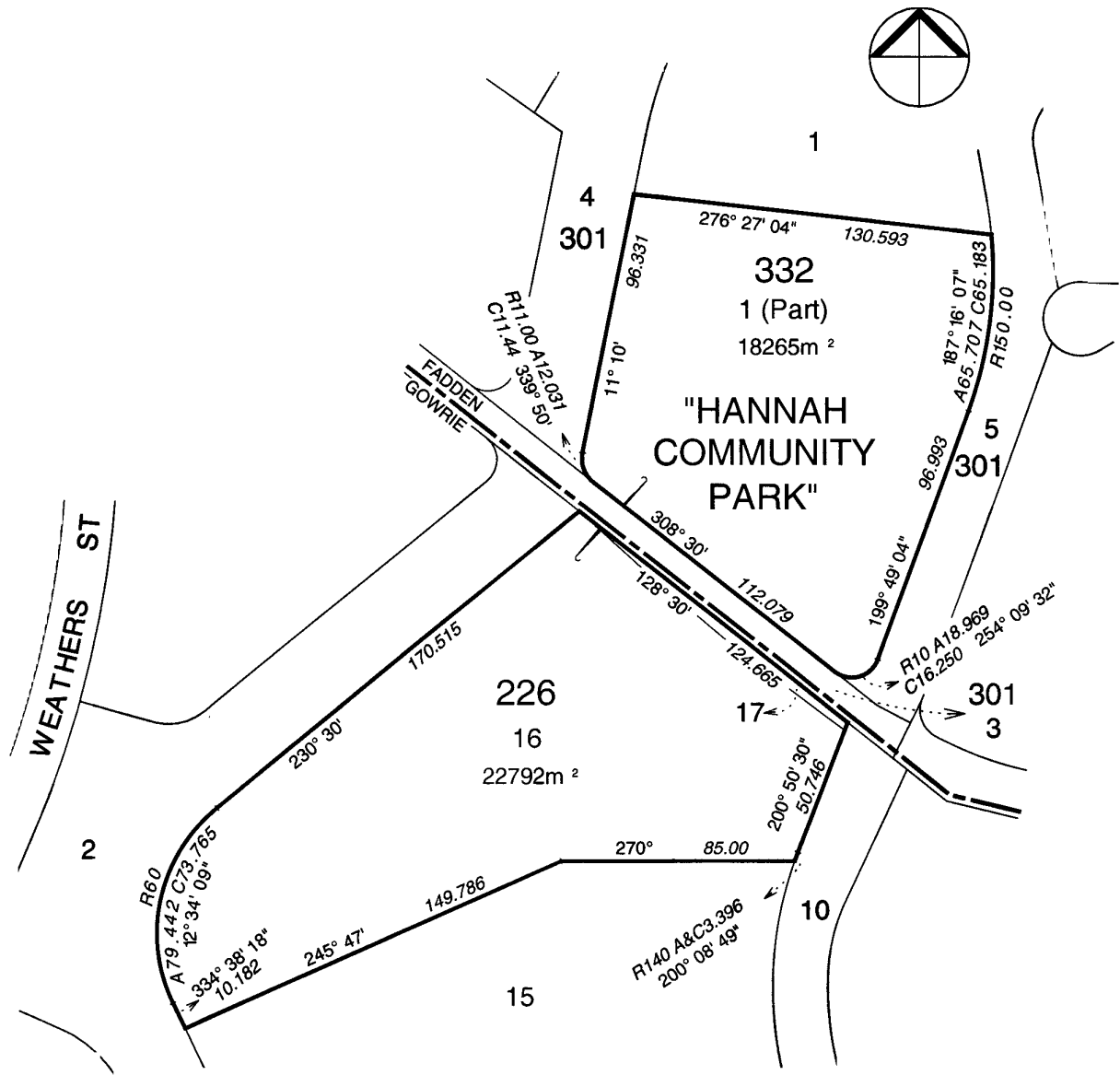

Hannah Community Park	Sir Colin Thomas Hannah KCMG; CB; CBE; (1914-1978)	<p>Air Force Officer & Governor of Queensland</p> <p>Air Marshal Sir Colin Thomas Hannah was born in 1914 at Menzies, Western Australia.</p> <p>In 1935 he enlisted in the Royal Australian Air Force. He began his training as an air cadet at No.1 Flight Training School, Point Cook, Victoria. He gained his wings in 1936.</p> <p>In 1939 he was transferred to England for armament training with the Royal Airforce. He began the course a week before the outbreak of World War II.</p> <p>Sir Hannah rose to become the Chief of the Australian Air Staff 1970-72. He resided in Canberra. During this time came the introduction of the F111 and the closing period of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam conflict.</p> <p>On retiring from the Royal Australian Air force Sir Colin became the Governor of Queensland 1972-77. During absences of the Governor General he assumed the position of Administrator.</p>
