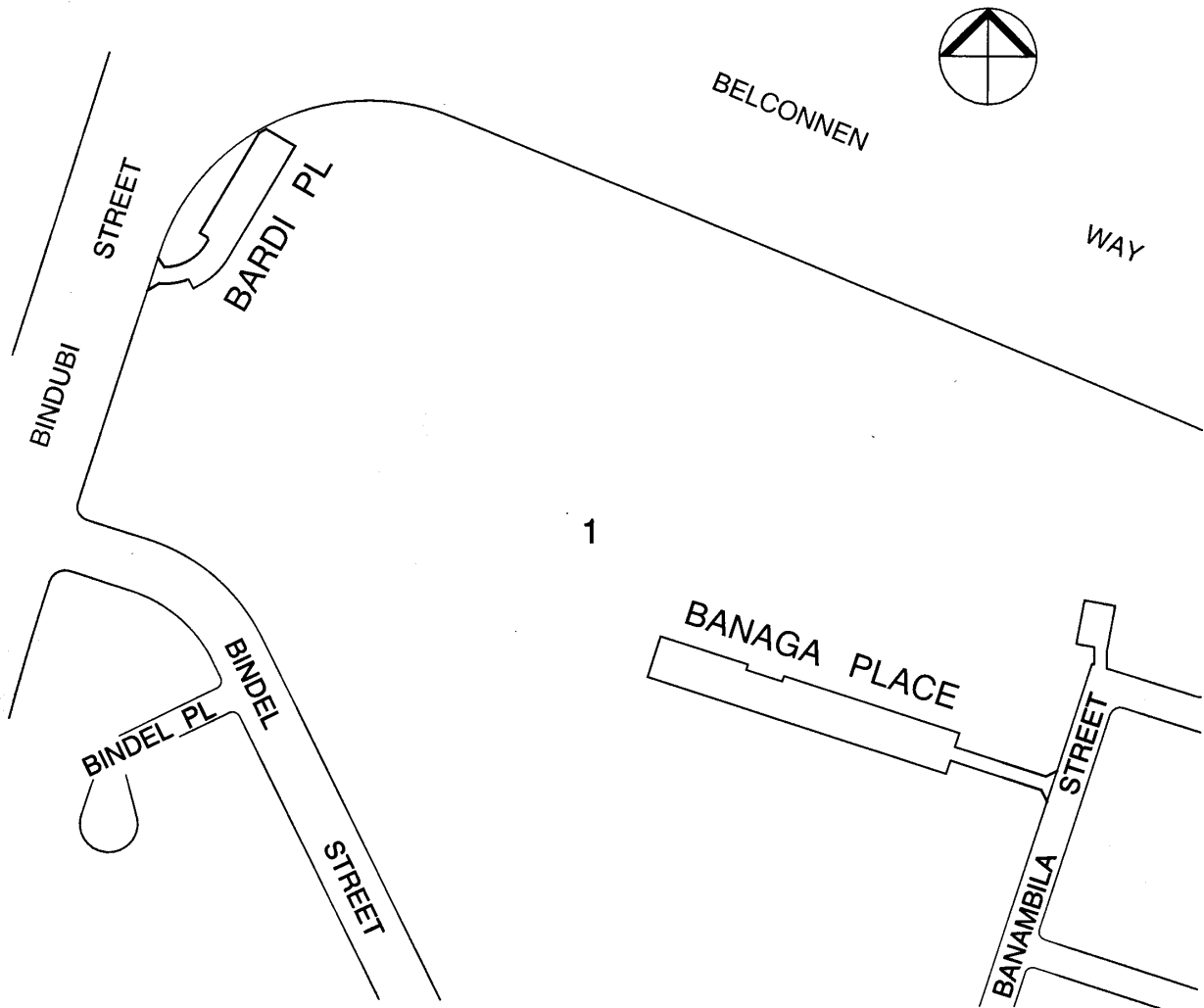

#### **Division of Aranda: Names of Aboriginal Tribal Units**

<b>NAME</b>	<b>ORIGIN</b>	<b>SIGNIFICANCE</b>
Banaga Place	Kamilaroi/ Gamilaraay language	Aboriginal word banaga-y – to run
Bardi Place	Bardi Tribal Unit	Aboriginal Tribal Unit  The Bardi people reside on Cape Leveque peninsula (north of Broome, Western Australia) from Cape Borda in the west to Cygnet Bay and Cunningham Point on the east coast.  The Bardi people are said to be the first aboriginals encountered by William Dampier, on 14 January 1688. He was the first person to refer to Australian aborigines.
