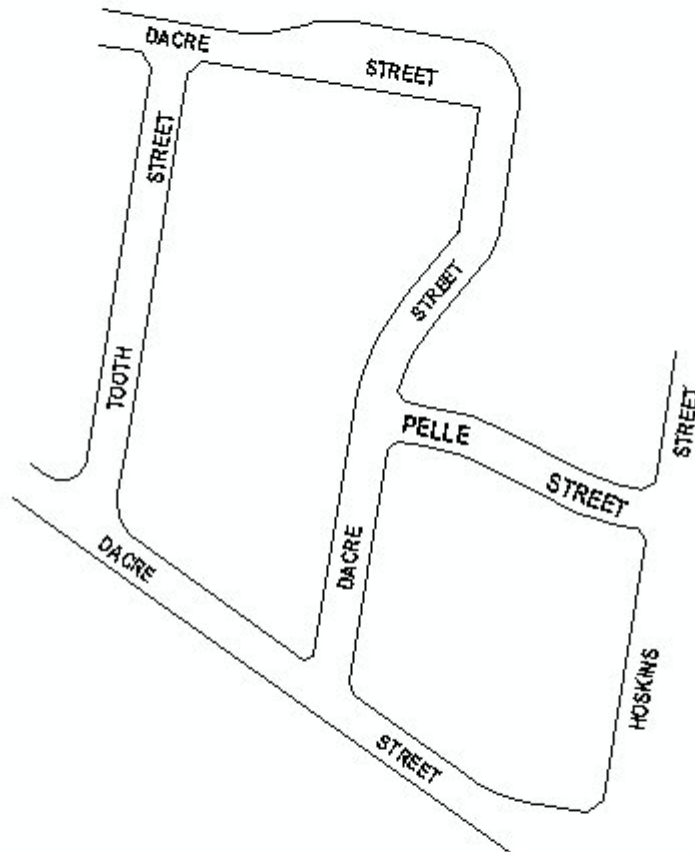

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Pelle Street	Giuseppe Pelle (1916-2002)	<p>Industry and community</p> <p>Giuseppe Pelle was born in San Luca, in the province of Reggio, Calabria, Italy. Giuseppe had no formal education and before migrating to Australia worked as a grazier and farmer to support his family.</p> <p>In 1957, leaving his wife and three children in San Luca, Giuseppe migrated to Canberra to start a new life and save enough money to enable his family to join him. They arrived in 1964.</p> <p>Giuseppe worked on capital works during Canberra's biggest growth period. This included digging trenches in order to lay mains pipes for the suburbs in the Canberra Central district. He also planted the pine trees along the Barton Highway.</p> <p>He encouraged and sponsored many Italian migrants to come to live and work in Canberra because he believed it to be a tranquil, safe and favourable city to live in.</p> <p>Giuseppe was a well respected member of the Italian community and was one of the founders of the Italo Australian Club in the ACT.</p>
