University of Canberra (Academic Progress) Amendment Statute 2005 (No 1)

Citation

1. This Statute may be cited as the *University of Canberra (Academic Progress) Amendment Statute 2005 (No 1)*.

Interpretation

2. In this Statute:

“**Principal Statute**” means the *Academic Progress Statute 1995*.

Amendment of section 3 of the Principal Statute

3. Section 3 of the Principal Statute is amended by inserting the following after the definition of “Academic Board”:

“**academic probation**” means, when applied to a student, that the student’s continuation of their course of study is subject to specified conditions;

Amendment of section 5 of the Principal Statute

4. Subsection 5(2)(b) of the Principal Statute is amended by omitting the following:

“to take action in respect of a student whose academic progress in a course of study, or a unit of a course of study, is found to be unsatisfactory by the appropriate review authority”

and inserting the following:

“to place on academic probation a student whose academic progress has been found by an appropriate review authority not to meet certain criteria; and

(c) to take action in respect of a student who has been placed on academic probation and who has been found by the appropriate review authority not to have met the conditions of that probation”
