# Road Transport (General) (Application of Road Transport Legislation) Declaration 2006 (No 1)

Disallowable instrument DI2006—10

made under the

**Road Transport (General) Act 1999, s13 (Power to exclude vehicles, persons or animals from road transport legislation)**

## **1 Name of instrument**

This instrument is the *Road Transport (General) (Application of Road Transport Legislation) Declaration 2006 (No 1)*.

## **2 Commencement**

This instrument commences on 10 February 2006.

## **3 Declaration**

I declare that the road transport legislation does not apply to competing vehicles participating in a ‘green’ special stage of the Brindabella Motor Sport Club Rallye des Femmes on 11 February 2006.

## **4 Expiry**

This declaration expires on 13 February 2006.

## **5 Definitions**

For this declaration, the following definitions apply:

### **Competing vehicle means:**

Any vehicle used for participating in a ‘green’ special stage of the event.

**Event means:**

The Brindabella Motor Sport Club Rallye des Femmes on 11 February 2006.

**‘Green’ special stage means:**

The period from the time when an event official declares a special stage active for rally competition until the time when an event official declares course control for that special stage closed.

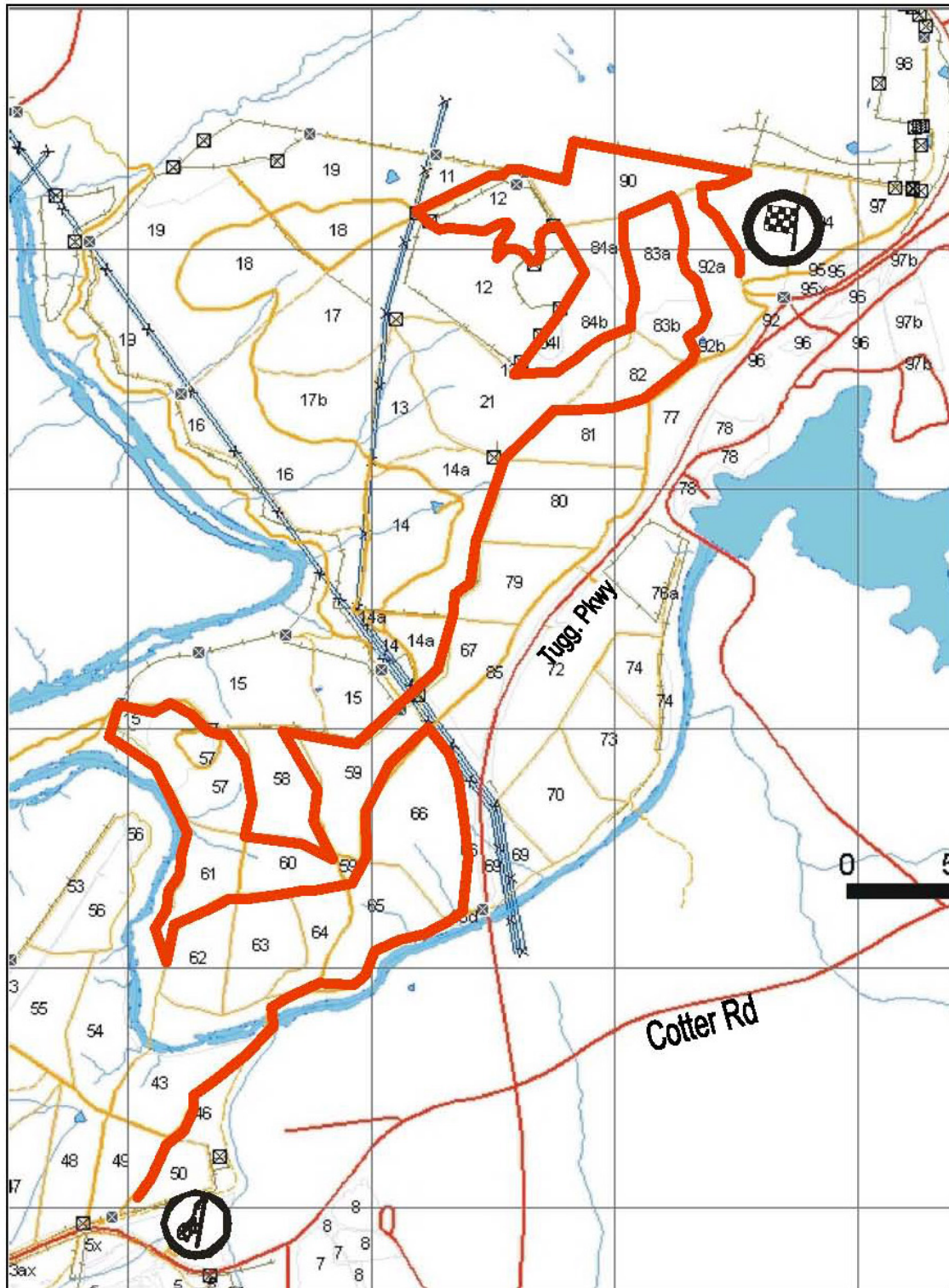
**Special stage means:**

The competitive routes for the following special stages shown on the attached maps:

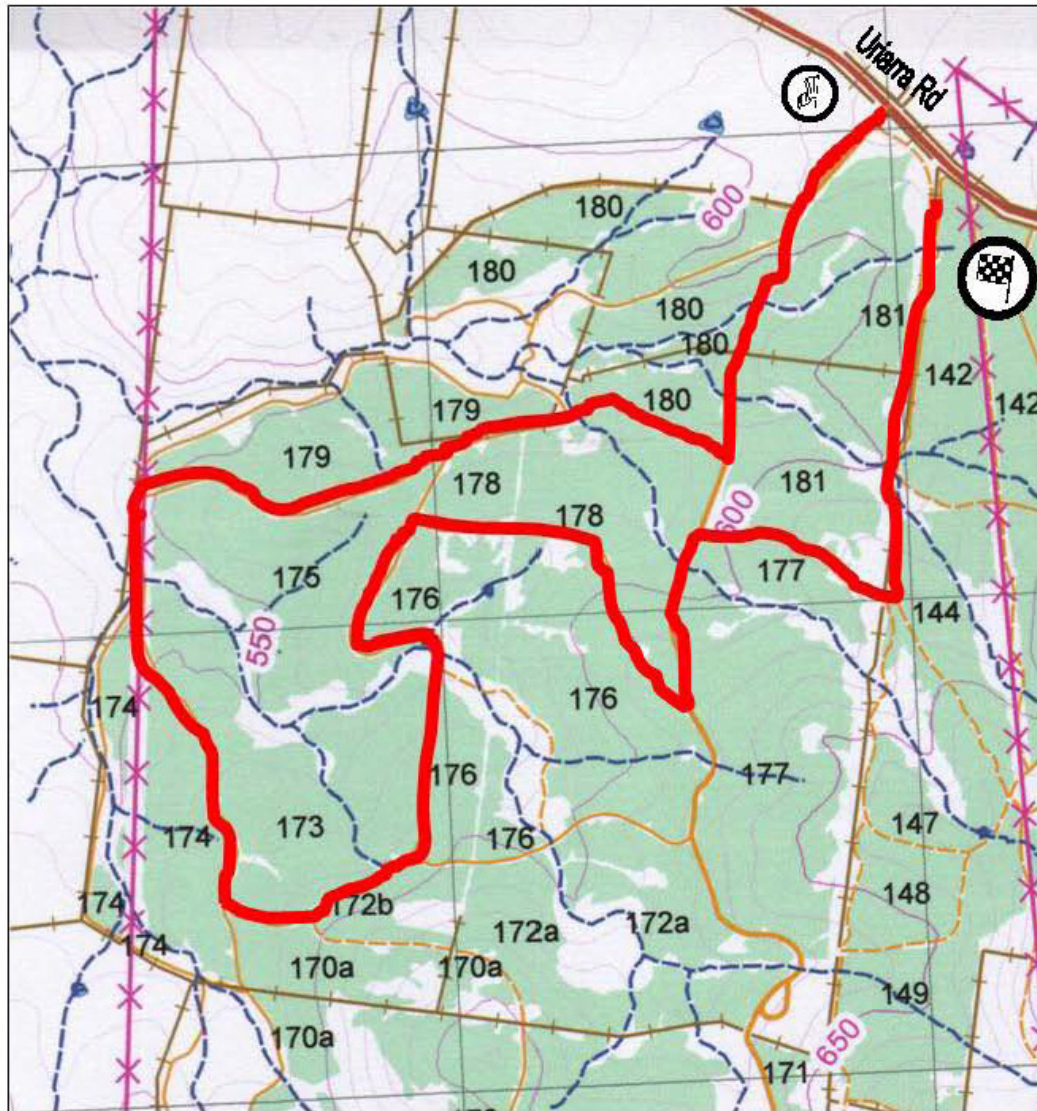
- Special stage 1 (SS1) – Greenhills I;
- Special stage 2 (SS2) – Snowy Hydro I;
- Special stage 3 (SS3) – Bluetts I;
- Special stage 4 (SS4) – Snowy Hydro II;
- Special stage 5 (SS5) – Greenhills II; and
- Special stage 6 (SS6) – Bluetts II.
