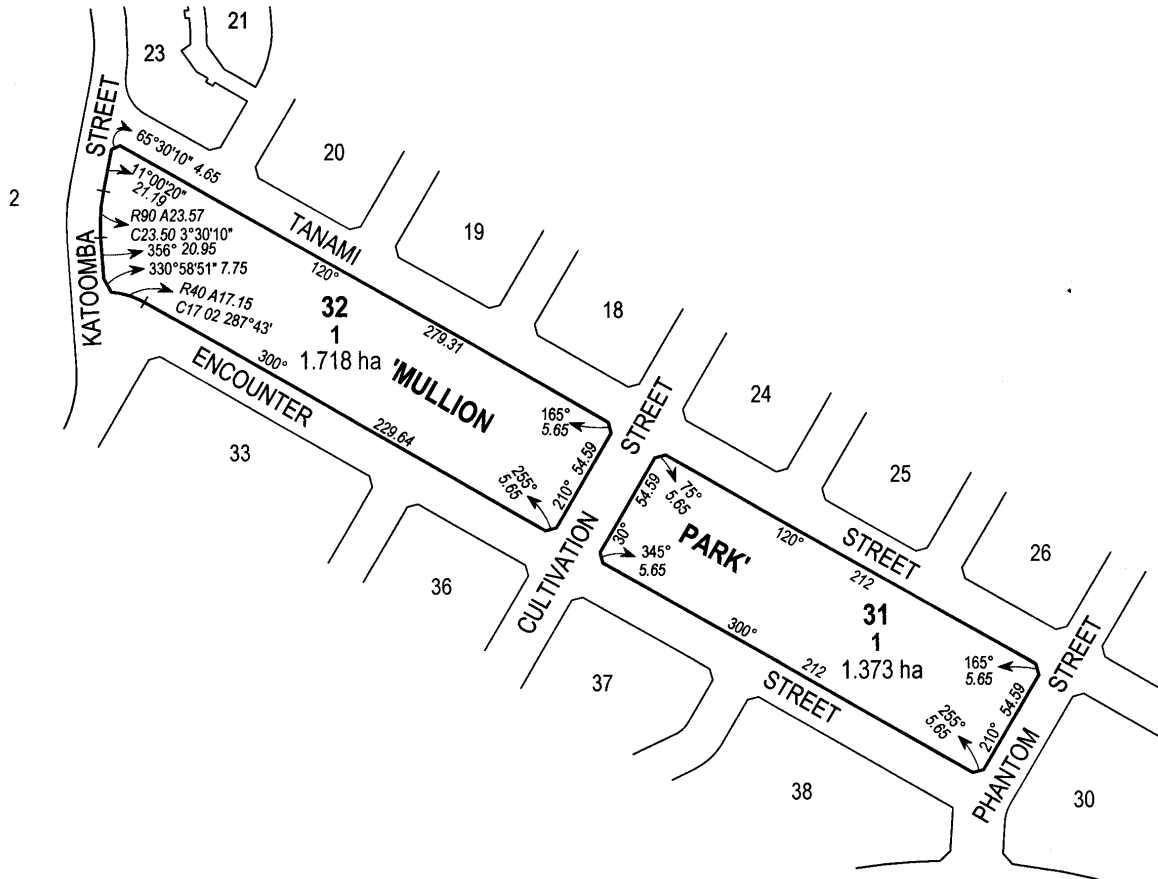
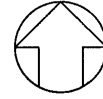

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Mullion Park	Mullion Hill NSW	<p>The theme for the naming of public places in Harrison is Natural Geographical Features of Australia and this area of urban open space is being named after Mullion Hill NSW.</p> <p>It is a hill rising about 260 metres from Mullion Creek. It lies about 3 kilometres East of Bobbys Hill and 2 kilometres North-West by North of Prosperity Hill in the Parish of Umbarra at Latitude 35° 08' S Longitude 148° 52' E</p> <p>The poem <i>The Miracle at Mullion Hill</i> (1956) was written by Australian poet David Watt Ian Campbell while he lived at <i>Wells Station</i> (very near the location of this park) between WWII and 1961.</p>
