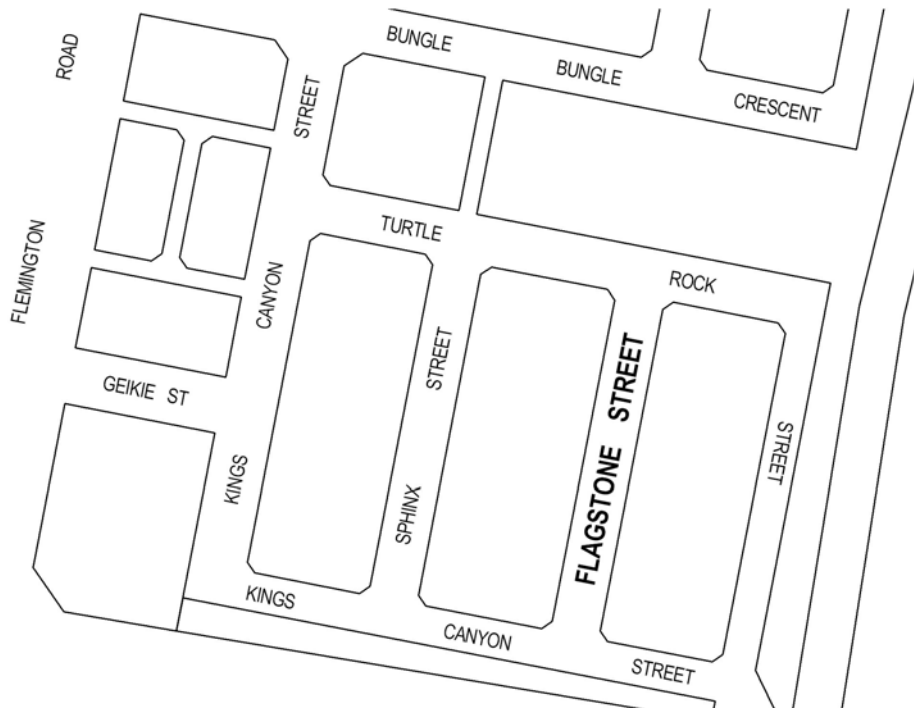

Flagstone Street	Flagstone Bench, Antarctica	Geographic feature



Flagstone Bench is a rocky bench on the southern side of Beaver Lake, MacRobertson Land, Antarctica about three metres above the surface of the lake.

The bench is littered with slabs of sandstone. Australian National Antarctic Research Expeditions (ANARE) survey parties have visited the Flagstone Bench Formation in 1957, 1958, 1959 and 1969.
