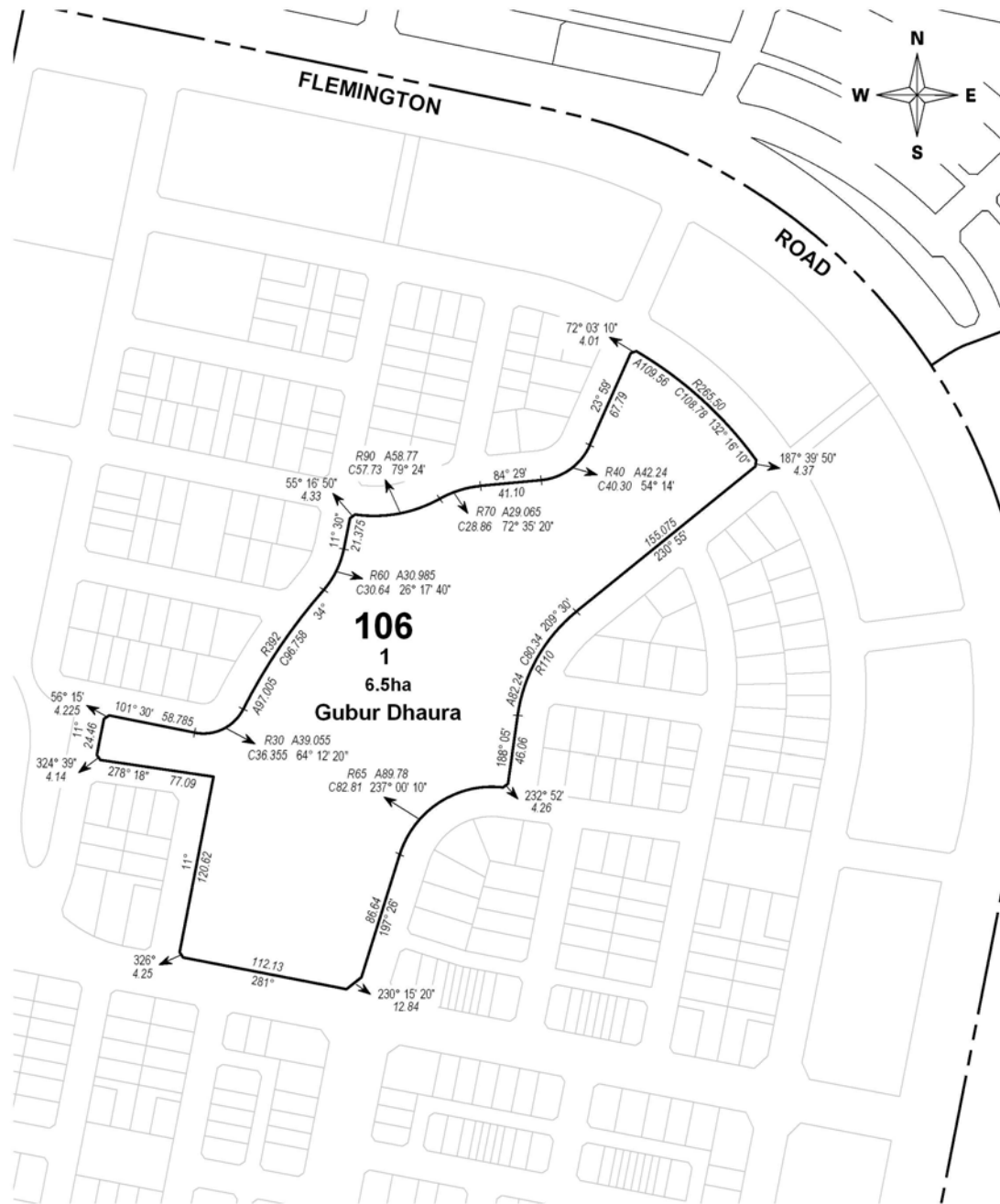

Gubur Dhaura	Gubur is a Ngunnawal word Dhaura is both a Ngunnawal and Ngarigu word.	<p>Gubur meaning 'red ochre'; Dhaura meaning 'ground'.</p> <p>This place has an abundant source of naturally occurring red and yellow ochres, which are considered an important source for Aboriginal communities, past and present.</p> <p>An abundant array of camping and grinding stones has been recovered from the site.</p>
