

John Cory Road	Douglas John Cory	Recycling Industry
	(1913-2001)	Douglas John Cory was born at Chingford in Essex, United Kingdom. He served with the RAF and then with Australian forces in Borneo and Malaya during World War II.
		Mr Cory began Canberra Oil Disposals in 1972 to collect oil from workshops, garages and other waste oil generators, continuing for over 30 years.
		Prior to 1975, waste oil from service stations and other commercial facilities in Canberra was taken to Pialligo tip and dumped in a lagoon. The lack of appropriate collection and recycling services posed a significant risk to the ACT environment and particularly its river systems. When the tip closed, Canberra Oil Disposals recovered over 13,700,000 litres of oil from the lagoons at the site.
		In 1991, Mr Cory received an ACT Environment Award for his long and distinguished commitment to oil recycling in the ACT and Queanbeyan region.
		Even though he transferred his business to Totalcare Industries in 1994, he remained actively involved in the oil recovery and recycling business until just before his death at 88 years of age.
		Mr Cory's work ensured that the ACT had an excellent oil recovery service with the result that the ACT's oil recovery levels have been world class thus protecting the environment and waterways of the ACT.
		Mr Cory was a main benefactor for Marymead, a not- for-profit community welfare service.
