NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Arndt Street	Ruth Arndt (1915-2001)	Community service, Canberra Ruth Arndt had a lifetime commitment to helping the disadvantaged and achieving social justice, first through her work as a social worker during the London Blitz and then as a migrant teacher and influential member of the Canberra community.
	Professor Heinz Wolfgang Arndt (1915-2002)	Heinz Arndt was a leading scholar of Asian economic development, gifted university teacher and migrant volunteer.
Doris Turner Street	Doris Anita Turner (1954-2003)	Community service, Canberra Doris was the Director of St Johns Care in Canberra, where she achieved her life's goal of helping others without judgement or prejudice, encouraging her volunteers to do the same.
Grannall Street	John Stanislaus Grannall (1915-1998)	Community service, Canberra Assisted migrants assimilate into Canberra life.
Huddy Street	Barbara Mary Ilene Huddy (1913-2007)	Community service, Canberra Volunteer at the Canberra Hospital (Acton).
Loma Rudduck Street	Loma Butterworth Rudduck née Amos (1914-2005)	Community service – Canberra Loma Rudduck was involved in numerous community organisations focussing on child-care, mothercraft and women's issues.
Marcus Street	Bernard Marcus (1924-1990)	Community service, Canberra Bernard Marcus came to Canberra from Brisbane in the late 1940s and was involved in community service from that time until his death in 1990.
Justice Kelly Street	John Joseph Anthony Kelly (1926-2006)	Community service, Canberra Supreme Court Judge, distinguished military service and community service.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Phyllis Frost Street	Dame Phyllis Frost AC DBE DSocSc (Hon) (1917-2004)	Community service, Melbourne Dame Phyllis Frost was a tireless voluntary community worker and social reformer.
Quinane Avenue	Frederick (Fred) Douglas Quinane (1921-2005)	Community service, Canberra Fred Quinane's community and public service commenced when he became the Secretary of the Sandringham Junior Lifesaving Club at the age of eight years and continued throughout his 84 years of life.
Eric Wright Street	Eric James Wright (1938-2006)	Community service, Canberra Lawyer, public servant, Anglican priest and volunteer.
Whyman Lane	Dorothy Frances (Fran) Whyman née Ring (1920-2003)	Community service, Bega Fran Whyman was faithfully dedicated to the RSL Ladies Auxiliary - serving as a founding member in 1949 and continuing until her death.
Zorzi Street	Antonio (Tony) Zorzi (1931-2000)	Community service, Canberra Antonio Zorzi assisted Italian migrants assimilate into Canberra life and volunteered his time to his parish and the St Vincent de Paul Society.
