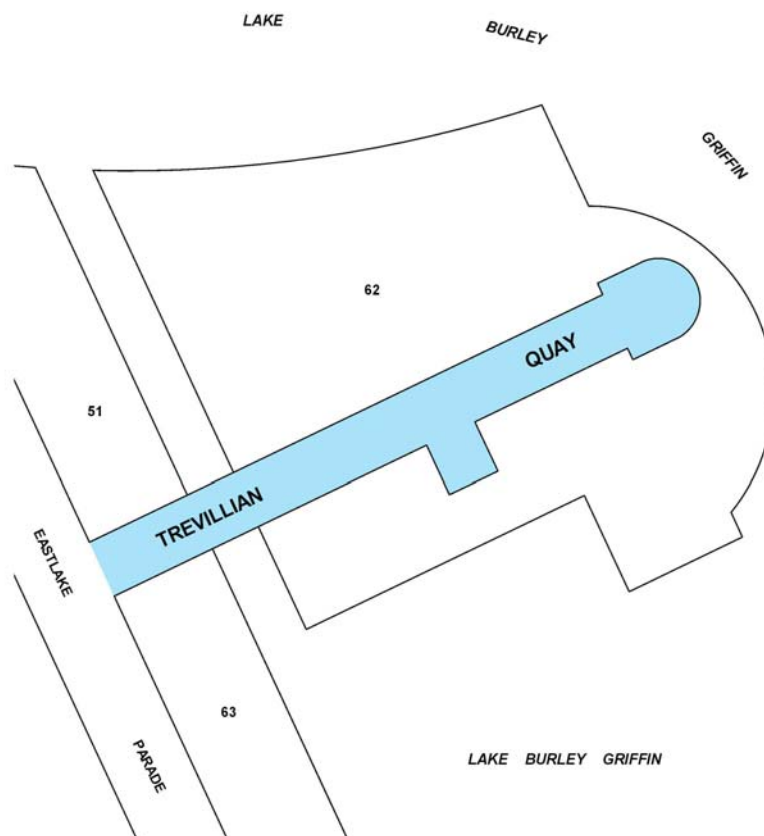

Division of Kingston: *Australian explorers and Kingston pioneers*

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Trevillian Quay	Thomas Henry Trevillian (1884-1962) Christina Trevillian nee Nilsson (1884-1968)	Kingston pioneers Tom and Christina Trevillian were among the first residents of Kingston. Mr Trevillian was appointed a position with the Powerhouse in 1919, and, in 1921 moved his family to Jardine Street, Kingston where they raised three sons: Thomas Henry, Trevor Glen and John Nilsson. The house was the first brick home built in Canberra; the postal address was “The Powerhouse via Eastlake”.
