

Lyall Gillespie was a fifth-generation Canberran and a descendant of the settlers to the Ginninderra district of Canberra. Lyall created over 40,000 hand-written information cards pertaining to local and Australian history.
		His distinguished Commonwealth Public Service career of over 40 years was served in Canberra culminating in his becoming the City Manager of the Department of Capital Territory from 1978-1982.
		In 1992 Lyall was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia for service to the community, particularly through the research and documentation of the history of the Canberra region.
