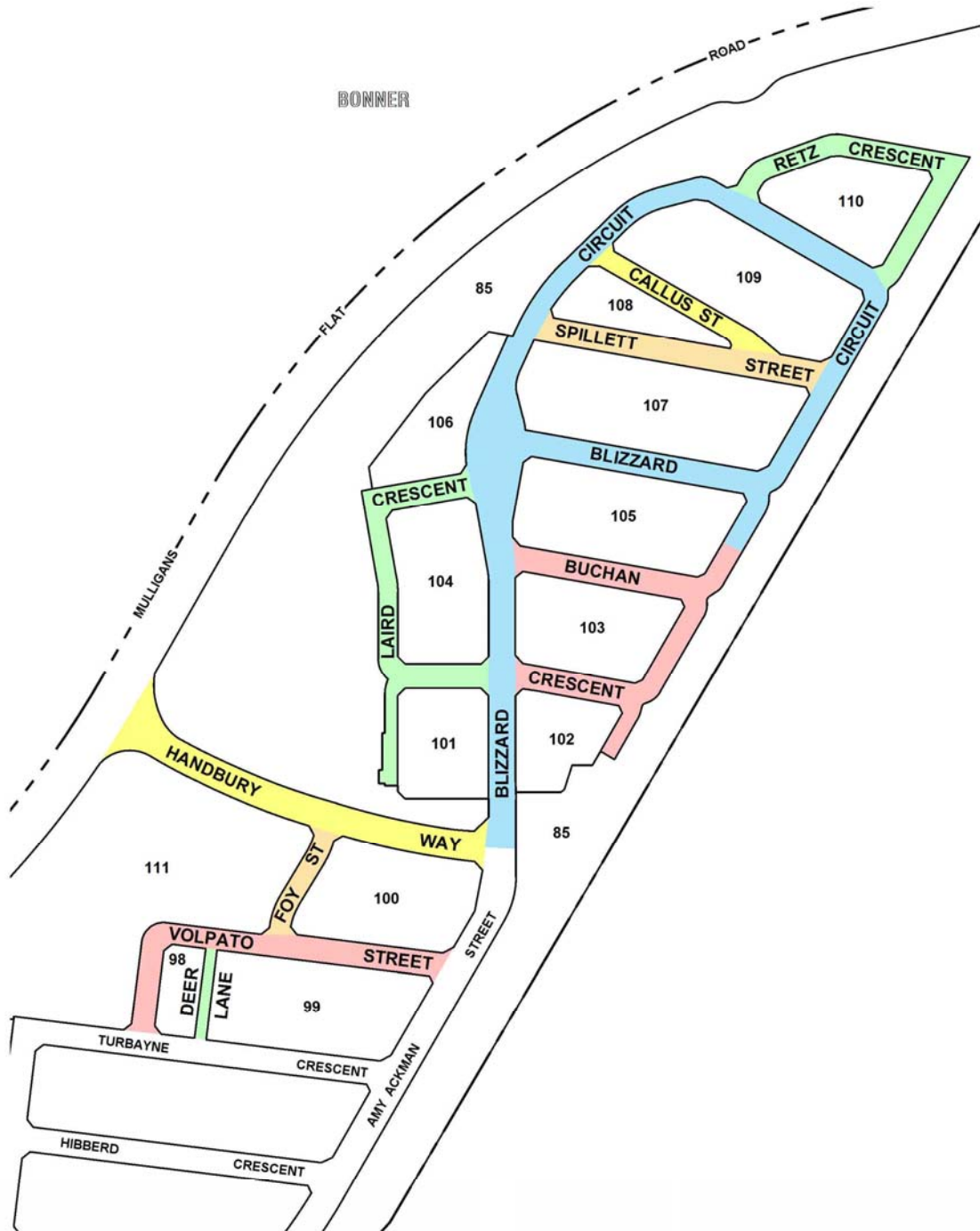

| NAME | ORIGIN | SIGNIFICANCE |

| Blizzard Circuit | Jan Mary Blizzard (1935-2007) | Community service Tasmania Served from 1983 to 1999 as coordinator and fundraiser for Multicap, an organisation supporting people with a disability; elected alderman of Burnie City Council in 2000 promoting the Burnie City Youth Council, Positive Ageing Committee and the preservation of parklands; awarded a Centenary Medal in 2001 in recognition of her service to the community and public. |
| Buchan Crescent | Sir John Buchan CMG (1909-1998) | Community service Victoria and nationally Co-founder of Apex clubs of Australia in 1931; served with the Royal Australian Engineers in WWII; prominent Melbourne architect; councillor Melbourne City Council; president of the Liberal Party of Victoria; state and federal president of the Australian-American Association; involved in design of the Australian Defence complex at Russell in Canberra and Southgate in Melbourne; advocate for youth employment. |
| Callus Street | Ursula Marie Callus (1939-2001) | Community service Australian Capital Territory Founder and administrator of the Canberra International Festival of Chamber Music which encouraged world's best performers of chamber music to visit Canberra and participate in classes for young musicians. Through her vision and enthusiasm, the festival grew in seven years from a local weekend event into a ten-day program with a national focus. |
| Deer Lane | Merle Elizabeth (Betty) Deer (1926 - 2007) | Community service South Australia Mitcham City Band secretary, fund raiser, band librarian and lobbyist over 30 years; recognised for her service to the band with a Community Service Award in 1994, an Australia Day Citizen's Award from Mitcham City Council in 2000 and the Centennial Medal in 2001. The South Australian Band Association awarded Betty a Badge of Merit and she became a Life Member of Mitcham City Brass. |

| Foy Street | George Foy (1883-1952) | Community service Queensland Long serving railway worker who devoted his leisure hours to helping the less fortunate in the Charters Towers community; he visited the elderly, doing their shopping and other chores that needed to be done; a caring and compassionate man now remembered through the George Foy Park and Tourist Information Centre in Charters Towers. |
| Handbury Way | Helen Handbury AO (1929-2004) | Community service and philanthropist Victoria Appointed an Officer of the Order of Australia for service to the communities of regional Victoria as a benefactor to a broad range of educational, health, social welfare, environmental, youth and cultural organisations, and to international humanitarian relief through the activities of CARE Australia. |
| Laird Crescent | Ewen Campbell Laird CBE (1906-1999) | Community service Victoria and nationally Co-founder of Apex clubs of Australia in 1931 that have promoted active citizenship to more than 210,000 young Australians. Laird was a Geelong architect who rose to prominence for his design of schools, factories, woolstores, hospitals and housing developments. |
| Retz Crescent | Pamela Marion Retz (1944-2004) | Community service, writer, Victoria Served the Warrandyte and Kangaroo Ground communities north-east of Melbourne through her involvement in various clubs and community groups; awarded the Lions Club's James D. Richardson Honour Award for support of Lions Club events and projects; active researcher of Australian genealogy who compiled details on over 24,000 related individuals. |
| Spillett Street | Peter Spillett AM (1926-2004) | Community service Northern Territory Councillor and then alderman of Darwin City Council; co-founder and president of the Historical Society of the Northern Territory; founder and president of National Trust (Northern Territory); committee member and vice-president of the local RSL and set up Darwin North branch; president of Pensioners Assoc; appointed Member of the Order of Australia in 1978 for his services to the community. |

| Volpato Street | Dr Floriano Francesco Volpato OAM (1924-2000) | Community service New South Wales A dedicated member of the Italian community in Lismore as Italian consular agent, justice of the peace, interpreter, real estate and travel agent; assisted the Italian banana growers to retain a greater percentage of their crop profits; established the New Italy Museum and Park of Peace Complex; a fine artist and singer, who received many awards, including the Medal of the Order of Australia in 1996, the National Australia Bank Ethnic Business Award for NSW and ACT in 1996, and the Cavaliere Award in 1999. |
