1. Name of instrument

This instrument is the *Nature Conservation (Species and Ecological Communities) Declaration 2012 (No 1)*.*

2. Commencement

3. Declaration

I declare that:

- (a) a species specified in:
 - (i) Schedule 1 is a vulnerable species; and
 - (ii) Schedule 2 is an endangered species, and
- (b) an ecological community specified in Schedule 3 is an endangered community.

4. Revocation

This instrument revokes the *Nature Conservation (Species and Ecological Communities) Declaration 2010* DI 2010-194.

Schedule 3 Endangered communities

Name of community	Description
Natural Temperate Grassland	A naturally occurring grassland of the temperate zone, dominated by native perennial tussock grasses, with associated native herbs and native fauna.
Yellow Box/Red Gum Grassy Woodland	A naturally occurring woodland of the temperate zone, in which Yellow Box co-occurs with Blakely's Red Gum. It includes the species rich understorey of native tussock grasses, herbs and scattered shrubs, together with a large number of native animal species.
