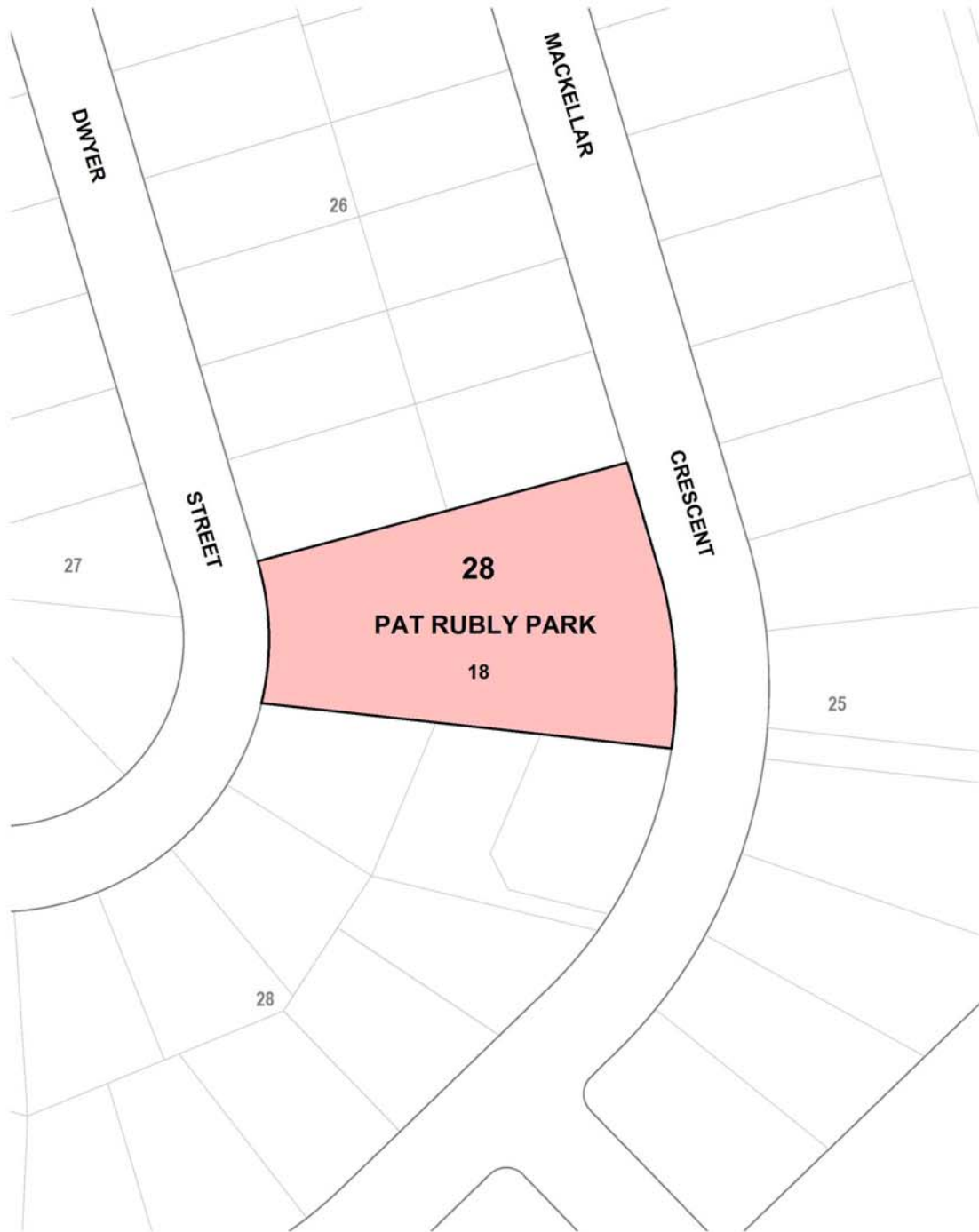

Pat Rubly Park	Grace Patricia (Pat) Rubly (nee Minty) (1912-2009)	<p>Local resident and community service</p> <p>Mrs Pat Rubly moved to Canberra from Cooma, New South Wales, in 1971 to retire in Mackellar Crescent Cook. She was a valued neighbour and respected member of the local community.</p> <p>Pat came from a literary and musical background and had performed in the theatre in Sydney. The name Mackellar Crescent had special significance to her as she had established a friendship with poet Dorothea Mackellar in the 1940s.</p> <p>Pat was an avid gardener and helped found the local garden club in the Cook area, remaining an active member of the club for many years. She was also an active member of the local View Club and volunteered with Canberra Legacy and St Vincent's Parish in Aranda.</p> <p>Pat was very welcoming to new residents in the neighbourhood and cared for many children in Mackellar Crescent after school and during the school holidays. She moved to aged care in Weston in 2002.</p>
