

Monty Place	William Joseph 'Monty' Tracey	Gungahlin pioneer, horse trainer and blacksmith
	(1899-1969)	Monty Tracey came to Canberra from Casino, NSW with the Burgoyne family in 1911. He rode horses for Joe Burgoyne in local race meetings in his early teenage years and moved with the Burgoyne family to the Deasland property in 1915 and onto the Gold Creek property in 1917. Worked as farm manager of Gold Creek during 1917–23 and horse trainer and blacksmith at Royal Military College Duntroon from 1923; followed the college to Sydney during its temporary relocation in 1930 and later returned to Canberra to work as stock inspector with the Department of Agriculture until retirement in 1964. He also served as
		a course marshal at Acton racecourse during the 1940s.
