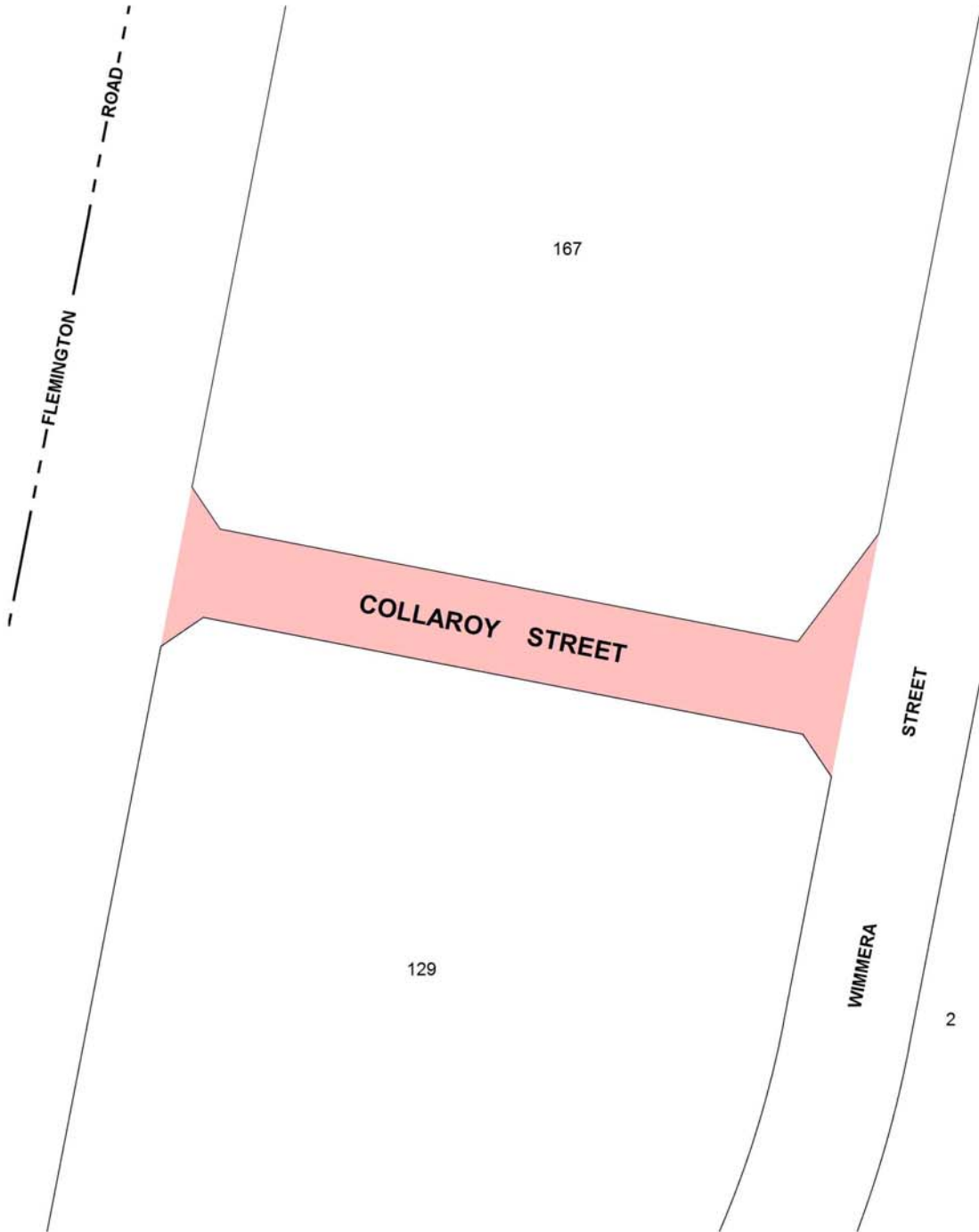

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Collaroy Street	Collaroy Basin New South Wales	Natural geographic feature A small coastal bay 16 kilometres north-east of Sydney city and 6 kilometres north of Manly. The area was originally considered part of Narrabeen, but after the coastal steamer 'Collaroy' ran aground just north of Long Reef in 1881, the basin and the surrounding area became known as 'Collaroy'. Fishermans Beach marks the shore of the basin.
