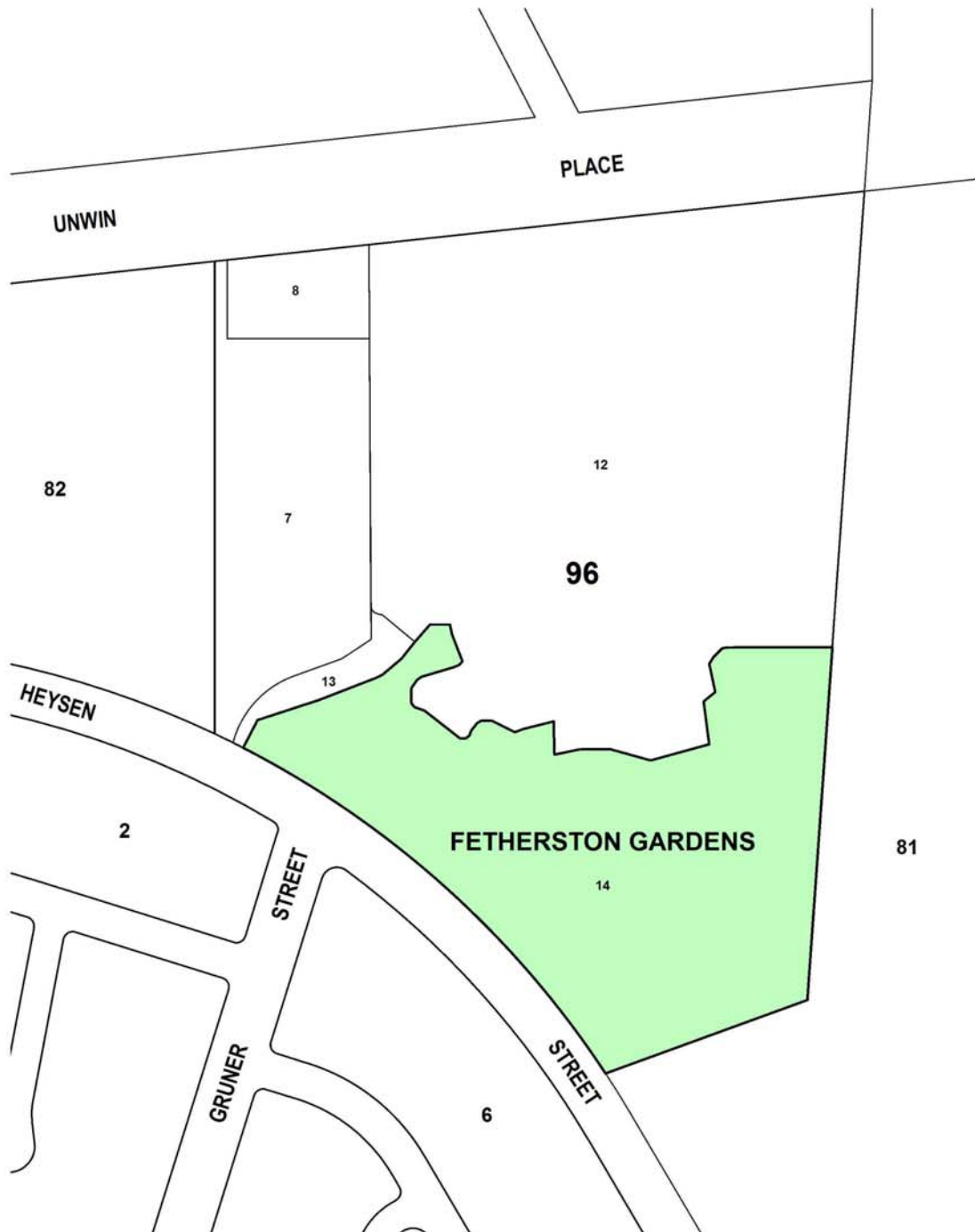

Fetherston Gardens	Gerald Henry (Tony) Fetherston MBE (1915-1980)	Horticulturist, landscape designer, educator Horticulture teacher Canberra from 1947 to 1952, Head of the School of Horticulture at the Canberra Institute of Technology (CIT) from 1964 until retirement in 1979. Oversaw the design and construction of the Weston CIT campus gardens and arboretum. In private business he undertook garden design and construction for various embassies and other significant Canberra gardens. Expert in iris breeding and cultivation and a horticultural mentor to residents through newspaper columns and radio broadcasts. His association with the CIT gardens is detailed in the publication <i>Fifty Years and Growing</i> (1997).
