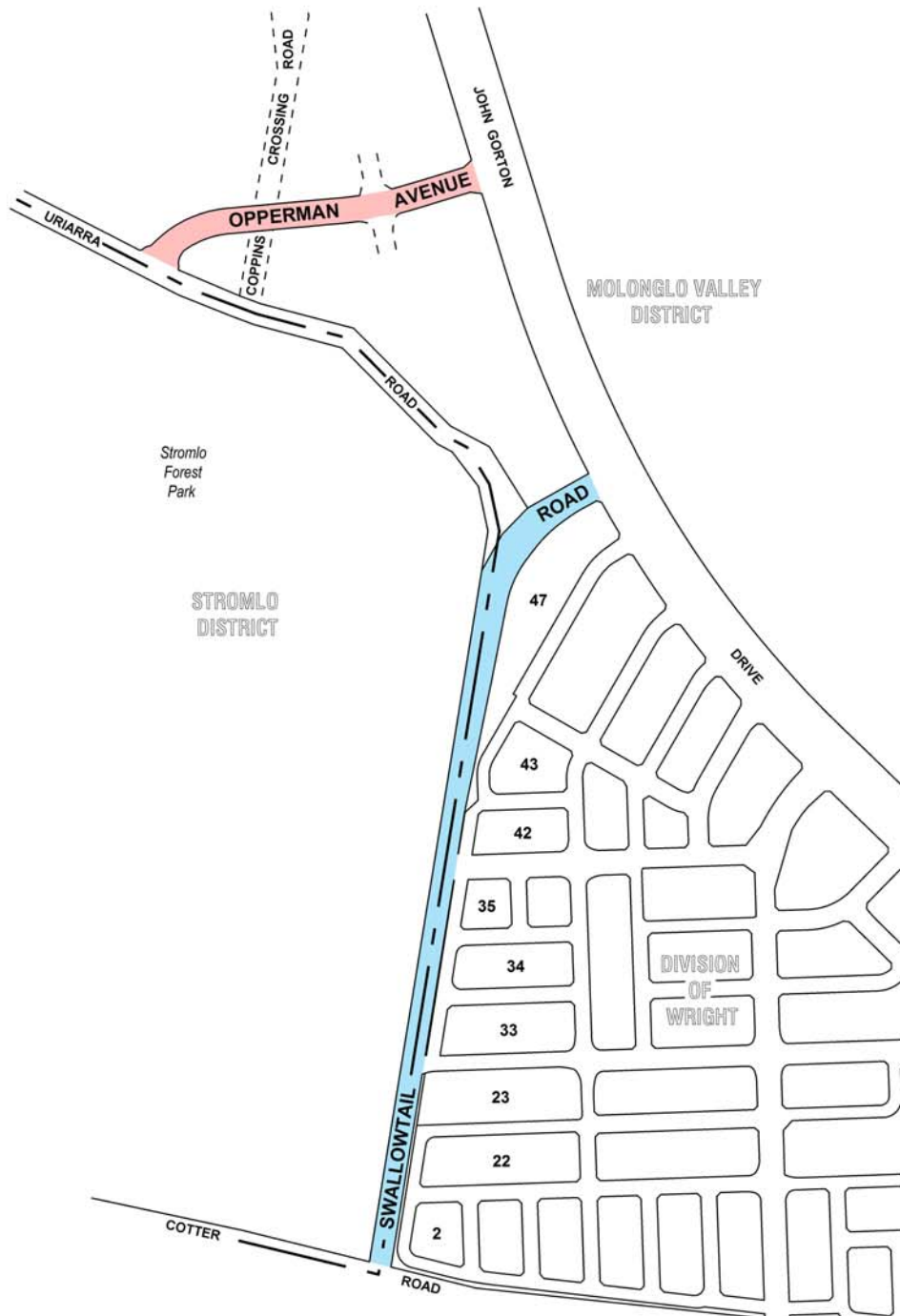

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Opperman Avenue	Sir Hubert Ferdinand Opperman OBE (1904-1996)	Champion cyclist, Federal politician, diplomat, writer and poet Australian and International cycling champion; National road champion in the 1920s; winner endurance races in Europe and Australia and world record holder. Captain, Australian Tour de France team 1928-31; winner the Bol d'Or (the Golden Bowl) 1928 and the Paris-Brest-Paris 1931; voted European Sportstar of the Year 1928. Flight Lieutenant RAAF during WWII; Federal politician serving under prime ministers Menzies and Holt; MHR Corio 1949-67; Government Whip 1955; Minister for Shipping and Transport 1960-63 and for Immigration 1963-66. Argued for reforms to the White Australia Policy and a less discriminatory approach to non-European immigration. High Commissioner to Malta 1967-72; appointed Knight Bachelor in 1968 in recognition of his services. Also known as an eloquent speaker, writer and poet; some of Sir Hubert's poetry is published in his autobiography 'Pedals, Politics and People' (1977).
Swallowtail Road	Macleay's Swallowtail Butterfly (<i>Graphium macleayanus</i>)	Butterfly, Papilionidae family The Macleay's Swallowtail butterfly is native to the wetter coastal and mountain parts of eastern Australia, from northern Queensland south to Victoria and Tasmania. It occurs naturally in the subalpine woodland in the Brindabella Range, ACT and the Snowy Mountains, NSW. It is identified by the tails on its hind wings and the rich green colour on the undersides of its wings. In the Brindabella Range and Snowy Mountains, the caterpillars of the subspecies feed on leaves of Mountain Pepper (<i>Tasmannia</i>).
