1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the *Road Transport (General) (Demerit Point Suspension Notice) Exemption Declaration 2013 (No 1).*

2 Commencement

This instrument is taken to have commenced on 24 May 2013.

3 Declaration

Under section 13 of the *Road Transport (General) Act 1999* I declare that the disapplied provisions do not apply to the holder of, or applicant for, a driver licence in the following circumstances:

1) the person:

- a. enters into an infringement notice management plan to discharge the infringement notice penalty for an infringement notice offence; or
- b. is granted a waiver of the infringement notice penalty for an infringement notice offence; and
- 2) the person has been subject to fine-default suspension for at least 1 year in relation to the infringement notice penalty to which the infringement notice management plan or waiver relates; and
- 3) the person became liable to demerit point suspension more than 1 year prior to entering into the infringement notice management plan, but has not served the demerit point suspension because the person has been subject to fine-default suspension for the duration of that period.
- 4) To avoid doubt, the disapplied provisions continue to apply to a person where the person commits a further infringement notice offence, and

has not been fine-default suspended for at least 1 year in relation to the further offence.

4 Definitions

In this instrument:

Disapplied provisions means:

- (a) section 16 of the *Road Transport* (*Driver Licensing*) Act 1999 (Consequences of incurring demerit points—holder of licence);
- (b) section 17 of the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Act 1999* (Consequences of incurring demerit points—applicant for issue or renewal of licence);
- (c) section 123 of the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2000* (Demerit points incurred by applicants for issue or renewal of learner or provisional licences);
- (d) section 124 of the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2000* (Demerit points incurred by learner and provisional licence holders);
- (e) section 126 of the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2000* (Demerit points incurred by applicants for issue or renewal of additional provisional classes);
- (f) section 127 of the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2000* (Demerit points incurred by holders of licences with additional provisional class);
- (g) section 130 of the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2000* (Demerit points incurred by restricted licence holders);
- (h) section 131 of the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2000* (Demerit points incurred by applicants for or holders of probationary licence);
- (i) section 132 of the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2000* (Demerit points incurred by probationary licence holders).

Driver licence has the same meaning as in the Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Act 1999

Demerit point suspension means a driver licence suspension or cancellation under any of the disapplied provisions.

Fine-default suspension means the suspension of a driver licence pursuant to section 44 of the *Road Transport (General) Act 1999*

Infringement notice management plan has the meaning given in the Road Transport (General) Act 1999

Infringement notice offence has the meaning given in the *Road Transport* (General) Act 1999

Infringement notice penalty has the meaning given in the *Road Transport* (General) Act 1999

Waiver, of an infringement notice penalty, means a waiver of an infringement notice penalty pursuant to section 31G of the *Road Transport (General) Act* 1999
