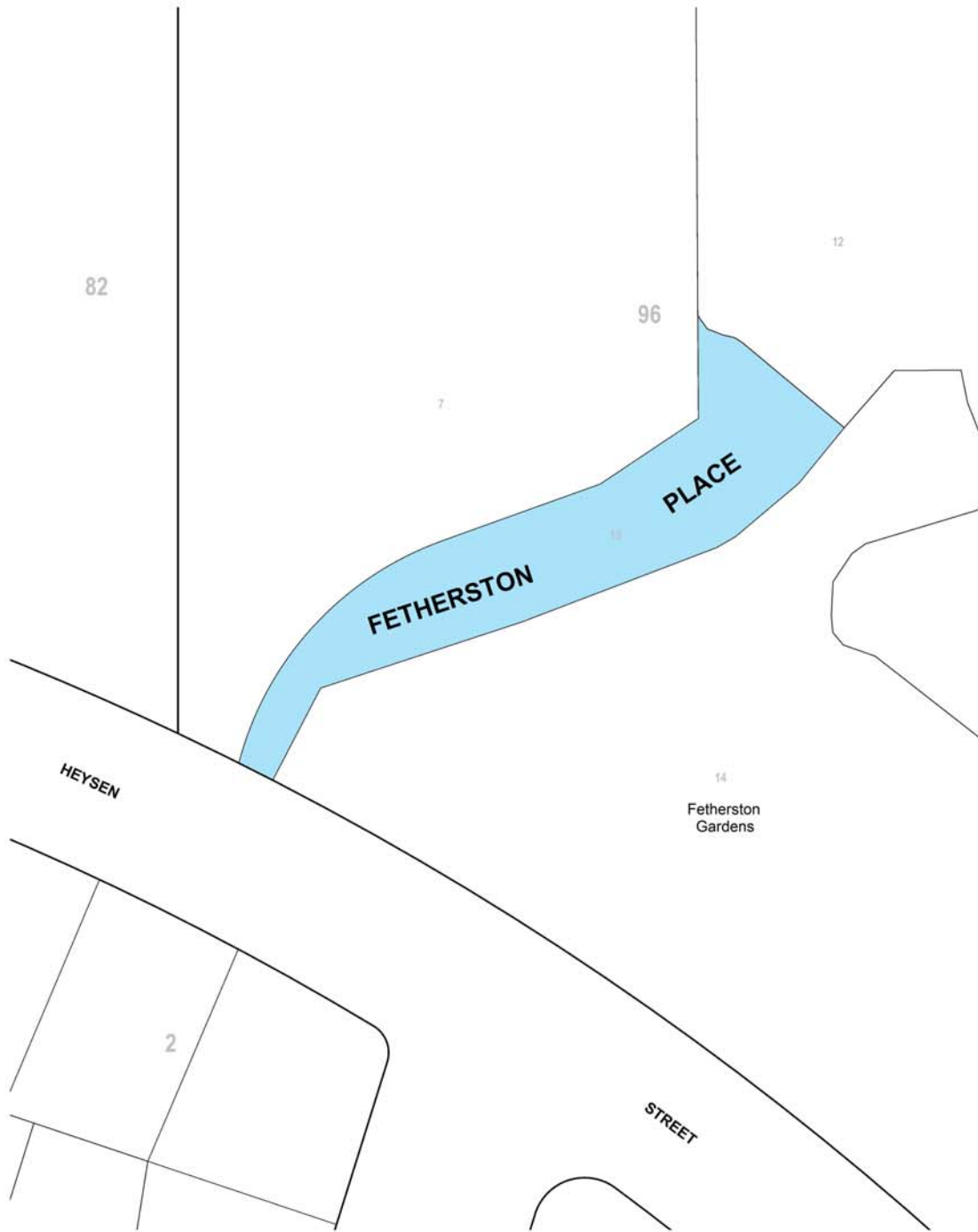

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
<b>Fetherston Place</b>	Gerald Henry (Tony) Fetherston MBE (1915-1980)	Horticulturist, landscape designer, educator and painter  Horticulture teacher, Canberra Technical College from 1948 until the mid-1950s. Head of the School of Horticulture, Canberra Institute of Technology (CIT) from 1964 until retirement in 1979. Tony Fetherston oversaw the design and construction of the Weston CIT campus gardens and arboretum. He was also an artist and painted watercolours while stationed with the Royal Australian Air Force in the Northern Territory during World War II. He continued to paint throughout his life, becoming proficient in acrylics and traditional Japanese and Chinese brush work receiving tuition and inspiration from artists in residence at the Canberra Technical College in Kingston. His work included hundreds of paintings depicting flowers and trees painted in the Chinese style on rice paper and later as spectacular themes in acrylics. Tony Fetherston held several solo exhibitions in Canberra and also exhibited in regional art shows.
