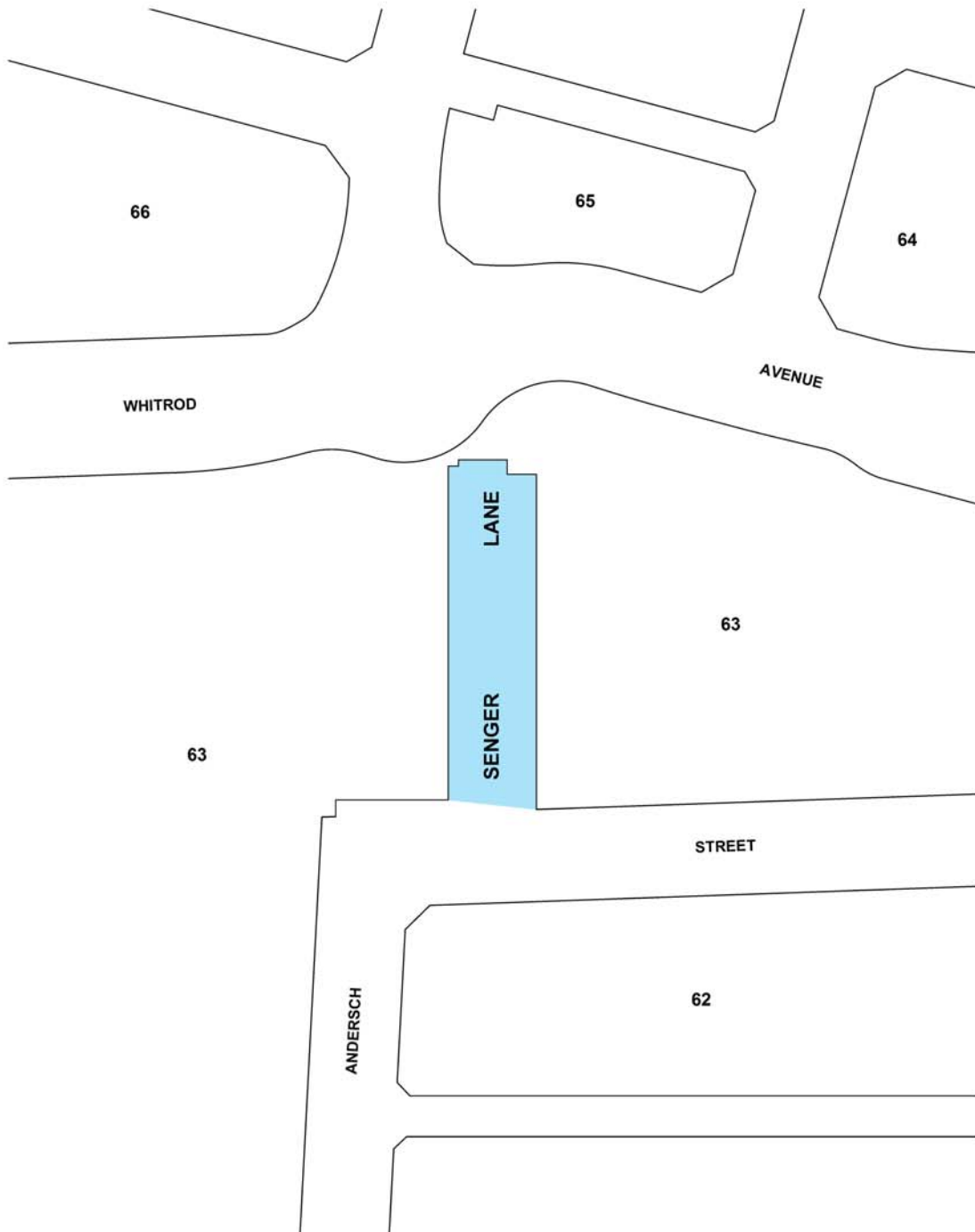

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Senger Lane	Albert Leopold Senger OBE (1910-1994)	Commonwealth public service Deputy Secretary, Department of Primary Industry 1964-72. Began his career with the State Savings Bank of Victoria 1927-35, and worked as an investment consultant 1935-41 before moving to Canberra to serve the Commonwealth Treasury 1941-46. Chief Economist for the Australian Wool Realisation Commission in Melbourne 1946-51. Appointed first Australian Trade Commissioner for Southern Europe and Commercial Counsellor at the Australian Legation in Rome 1951-54 and posted as Trade Commissioner to Washington DC 1954-56. First Assistant Secretary, Department of Primary Industry 1956-64. Served as Government representative on several boards overseeing produce such as wool, wine, tobacco and canned fruits. Appointed an Officer in the Order of the British Empire in 1961.
	Andrew Charles Senger (1945-2009)	Commonwealth and Australian Capital Territory public service Town planner and development assessment officer with the National Capital Development Commission 1986-1989 and ACT Government agencies – Department of Environment, Land and Planning; Planning and Land Management; and ACT Planning and Land Authority – 1989-2009. Managed numerous Canberra residential and commercial development assessments over two decades. Actively promoted equal employment opportunities for people with a disability. (Son of Albert Leopold Senger.)

Craig Andrew Senger
(1973-2009)

Commonwealth public service

Australian Trade Commissioner and leader of Austrade's ASEAN Mining and Energy team in Indonesia from March 2008 until his tragic death from a terrorist attack in Jakarta in July 2009. Served Austrade for 11 years firstly in human resources and their South East Asia Regional Office in Canberra, before moving to Sydney in 2001 as an export adviser. Played a key role in the OZMINE trade show in Indonesia drawing over 80 Australian businesses to exhibit - the largest Austrade organised mining event in 10 years. Undertook assignments in Milan, New Delhi and with Australia Week in Moscow. Now commemorated by an annual Craig Senger Award initiated by Austmine to celebrate excellence in the export of mining, equipment, technology and services globally, and by an Austrade/Monash University Craig Senger Scholarship.
