NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Blaxland Park	Gregory Blaxland (1778-1853)	Early settler and explorer of New South Wales In 1813 Gregory Blaxland accompanied William Charles Wentworth and Lieutenant William Lawson in the first recognised European crossing of the Blue Mountains across the Great Dividing Range in NSW. The expedition achieved success by traversing the mountains by the ridges instead of looking for a route through the valleys. Ten years later Blaxland published ' <i>A Journal of a Tour of Discovery Across the Blue Mountains, New South Wales in the Year 1813</i> ' (London, 1823).
