Road Transport (General) Application of Road Transport Legislation Declaration 2017 (No 5)*

Road Transport (General) Act 1999, s 13 (Power to exclude vehicles, persons or animals from road transport legislation)

1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the *Road Transport (General) Application of Road Transport Legislation Declaration 2017 (No 5).*

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on 19 August 2017.

3 Declaration – third party insurance

(1) I declare that the *Road Transport (Third-Party Insurance) Act* 2008 does not apply to a designated vehicle while being used to participate in the event for any period beginning on an event official declaring (in whatever manner the event official describes) the event course active for a testing session, media event or ticketed event and ending on an event official declaring the event course inactive.

Note A reference to an Act includes a reference to the statutory instruments made or in force under the Act, including any regulation, (see Legislation Act 2001, s 104).

- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply if the designated vehicle is—
 - (a) covered under a policy of compulsory third-party insurance of a place other than the ACT or under a law of the Commonwealth; or
 - (b) subject to coverage under a compulsory motor vehicle or trailer accident compensation scheme of a place other than the ACT or of the Commonwealth.

4 Declaration – other road transport legislation

I declare that the following provisions of the road transport legislation do not apply to a designated vehicle or the driver of a designated vehicle while participating in the event at BBT 2017 for any period beginning on an event official declaring (in whatever manner the event official describes) the course active for a testing session, media event or ticketed event and ending on an event official declaring the event course inactive:

- (1) the Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Act 1999;
- (2) the Road Transport (Safety and Traffic Management) Act 1999; and
- (3) the Road Transport (Vehicle Registration) Act 1999.

5 Definitions

In this instrument:

designated vehicle means any of the following vehicles:

- (a) a registered or unregistered promotional or official vehicle;
- (b) an unidentified motor vehicle;
- (c) an uninsured motor vehicle.

event means the Big Boys Toys 2017 'Race your mate' driving experience.

event course means a road or road related area used as a course designed and approved under the '2017 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport Khanacross Regulations' within the grounds of Exhibition Park in Canberra as indentified on the attached map.

event official means an official for the event who holds an official's licence from the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd that authorises the official to declare the event course active or inactive.

registered means registered under the *Road Transport (Vehicle Registration)*Act 1999.

unidentified motor vehicle—see the *Road Transport (Third-Party Insurance) Act 2008*, section 62.

uninsured motor vehicle—see the *Road Transport (Third-Party Insurance) Act 2008*, section 60.

6 Expiry
