# **Animal Welfare (Advisory Committee) Establishment 2020 (No 1)**

Disallowable instrument DI2020 - 147

made under the

Animal Welfare Act 1992, section 109 (Establishment and Functions)

#### 1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the Animal Welfare (Advisory Committee) Establishment 2020 (No 1).

#### 2 Commencement

This instrument commences the day after it is notified.

#### 3 Establishment of Committee

The Animal Welfare Advisory Committee (the *advisory committee*) is established.

## 4 Appointment of Committee Members

- (1) The Minister must appoint the advisory committee members.
  - Note 1 For the making of appointments (including acting appointments), see the Legislation Act, Pt 19.3.
  - Note 2 In particular, an appointment may be made by naming a person or nominating the occupant of a position (see Legislation Act, S207).
  - Note 3 Certain Ministerial appointments require consultation with an Assembly committee and are disallowable (see Legislation Act, div 19.3.3).
- (2) The term of an appointment under this section must not be longer than 3 years.
- (3) The Minster may not reappoint a member nominated by a non-public service entity for more than 2 consecutive terms unless the Minister
  - a. has received a written submission requesting the reappointment of the member from the entity; and
  - b. is satisfied that the person should be reappointed.
- (4) A person nominated by a non-public service entity must not participate in a meeting of the advisory committee unless the person has signed a deed of confidentiality and conflict of interest in relation to the person's membership of the advisory committee.

## 5 Advisory committee members

The advisory committee must be made up of the following members:

- (1) a chair who is not affiliated with an animal welfare or animal user group;
- (2) a person who is an authorised officer under the Animal Welfare Act 1992;
- (3) a person nominated by the RSPCA ACT;
- (4) a person nominated by the Australian Veterinary Association;
- (5) a person nominated by the ACT Rural Lessees Association;
- (6) a person, with experience in teaching or research in the field of animal sciences, nominated by
  - a. the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (the CSIRO); or
  - b. an ACT tertiary institution;
- (7) a person nominated by a community-based organisation involved in animal welfare, other than the RSPCA ACT;
- (8) a person nominated by a community-based organisation involved in native wildlife matters;
- (9) a person nominated by an organisation involved in the commercial use of companion animals;
- (10) a person nominated by an organisation involved in the recreational or sporting use of animals;
- (11) a person nominated by the administrative unit with responsibility for the *Nature Conservation Act 2014*.

# 6 Deputy Chair

The members of the advisory committee must elect a member to be the deputy chair of the committee.

# 7 Chair and deputy chair

- (1) The chair presides at all meetings at which the chair is present.
- (2) If the chair is absent, the deputy chair presides.
- (3) If the chair and the deputy chair are absent, the member chosen by the members present presides.

#### 8 Quorum for advisory committee meetings

Business may be carried on at an advisory committee meeting only if at least half of the advisory committee's members are present.

## 9 Voting at meetings

- (1) At a meeting of the advisory committee, each member as a vote on each question to be decided.
- (2) A question is decided by a majority of the votes of the members present and voting, but if the votes are equal
  - a. the chair has a casting vote; and
  - b. if the chair is not present at the meeting the deputy chair has a casting vote; and

c. if neither the chair nor the deputy chair are present – the member presiding has a casting vote.

## 10 Advisory committee – general procedure

- (1) Meetings of the advisory committee may be held when and where the committee decides.
- (2) However, the chair must call a meeting
  - a. at least each month (other than January and December) and additionally as often as needed for the committee to efficiently carry out its functions; and
  - b. if asked by the Minister.
- (3) The chair must give the other members of the committee at least 5 working days written notice of a meeting.
- (4) The advisory committee may otherwise conduct its proceedings (including its meetings) as it considers appropriate.

# 11 Advisory committee may form subcommittees

- (1) The advisory committee may form subcommittees to deal with particular matters.
- (2) The formation, and membership of, a subcommittee must be decided by the advisory committee.
- (3) A recommendation of a subcommittee may only be taken to be a recommendation of the advisory committee if a recommendation is endorsed by the advisory committee.

## 12 Advisory committee to keep minutes

The advisory committee must keep minutes of its meetings.

#### 13 Secretariat services to the committee

The Committee may request secretariat services from the administrative unit with responsibility for the *Animal Welfare Act 1992*.

### 14 Protection of advisory committee members

- (1) An advisory committee member is not personally liable for conduct engaged in honestly and not recklessly
  - a. in the exercise of a function of the committee; or
  - b. in the reasonable belief that the conduct was in the exercise of a function of the committee.
- (2) Any civil liability that would, apart from this section, attach to a person attaches instead to the Territory.
- (3) In this section:

*Advisory committee member* includes anyone acting under the director or authority of the advisory committee.

Conduct means an act or an omission to do an act.

## 15 Ending appointment of advisory committee members

- (1) The Minister must end the appointment of an advisory committee member if
  - a. the Minister becomes aware that the member
    - i. has failed to sign a deed mentioned in section (4); or
    - ii. has been declared bankrupt; or
    - iii. has been convicted, in Australia, of an offence punishable by imprisonment for at least 12 months; or
    - iv. has been convicted, outside of Australia, of an offence that, if it had been committed in the ACT, would be punishable by imprisonment for at least 12 months; or
    - b. is satisfied that the member is no longer qualified to be appointed to the member's position.
- (2) The Minster may end the appointment of an advisory committee member
  - a. if the member is absent from 3 consecutive meetings of the advisory committee other than on approved leave; or
  - b. if the member contravenes a territory law; or
  - c. for misbehaviour; or
  - d. for physical or mental incapacity, if the incapacity substantially affects the exercise of the members functions.

*Note 4:* A person's appointment also ends if the person resigns (see Legislation Act, s210).

(3) In this section:

**Qualified**, for a member nominated by a non-public service entity, includes retain the confidence of the entity that the nominated person for appointment to the advisory committee.

#### 16 Revocation of NI2015-219

This instrument revokes notifiable instrument NI2015-219 Animal Welfare (Advisory Committee) Establishment 2015.

## 17 Transitional—members of advisory committee

The Animal Welfare (Advisory Committee Member) Appointment 2019 (No 1) DI2019-216 and the Animal Welfare (Advisory Committee Member) Appointment 2019 (No 2) DI2019-286 are taken to be made under section 4 of this instrument.
