1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the *Road Transport (Safety and Traffic Management) Airservices Australia Emergency Worker Declaration 2020 (No 1).*

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on the day after notification.

3 Declaration

I declare that a person who is an employee of Airservices Australia and who is a member of the Rescue and Firefighting Service is an *emergency worker*, when the member is driving an *emergency vehicle* to respond to an emergency at or near an airport.

Note 1: a person who is an emergency worker may drive an emergency vehicle.

Note 2: Section 306 (Exemption-driver of emergency vehicle) of the *Road Transport (Road Rules) Regulation 2017* provides that a provision of the *Road Transport (Road Rules) Regulation 2017* does not apply to the driver of an *emergency vehicle*, providing that the driver is taking reasonable care and it is reasonable that the provision should not apply, and if the vehicle is moving, the vehicle is displaying a blue or red flashing light or sounding an alarm.

4 Definitions

In this instrument:

Airservices Australia means the body established under section 7 of the *Air Services Act 1995* (Cwlth).

Rescue and Firefighting Service means the rescue and firefighting service provided under division 4 of part 2 of the *Air Services Regulations 2019* (Cwlth).

Emergency vehicle – see *Road Transport (Road Rules) Regulation 2017*, dictionary

Emergency worker – see *Road Transport (Road Rules) Regulation 2017,* dictionary

5 Revocation

This instrument revokes *Road Transport* (*Safety and Traffic Management*) *Airservices Australia Emergency Worker Declaration 2012* DI2012-242.
