Road Transport (General) Concession Determination 2022 (No 1)

Disallowable instrument DI2022-21

made under the

Road Transport (General) Act 1999, section 96 (Determination of fees, charges and other amounts)

1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the *Road Transport (General) Concession Determination 2022 (No 1)*.

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on 13 April 2022.

3 Revocation

Disallowable instrument DI2021-83, Road Transport (General) Concession Determination 2021 (No 1) is revoked.

4 Determination of concessions

The concessional fee payable under the road transport legislation for an item in the schedule is to be worked out in accordance with the following formula:

 $\mathbf{CF} = \mathbf{DF} - (\mathbf{DF} \times \mathbf{C})$ (rounded down to the nearest 10 cents)

5 Entitlement to concession

- (1) A person eligible for only 1 concession mentioned in part 1 of schedule 1 in relation to a vehicle may claim the concession in relation to only 1 vehicle.
- (2) A person eligible for more than 1 concession mentioned in part 1 of schedule 1 in relation to a vehicle may claim:
 - (a) only 1 concession in relation to a vehicle; and
 - (b) the concession only in relation to 1 vehicle.
- (3) A person eligible for more than 1 concession mentioned in part 2 of schedule 1 in relation to a vehicle may claim:
 - (a) only 1 concession in relation to each vehicle; and
 - (b) the concession only in relation to a total of 2 goods carrying vehicles and 1 trailer and 1 tractor.
- (4) A person eligible for more than 1 concession mentioned in part 2 or 3 of schedule 1 in relation to a vehicle may claim only 1 concession at a time in relation to each vehicle.

- (5) A person eligible for more than 1 concession mentioned in part 4 of schedule 1 in relation to a driver licence may only claim one concession at a time in relation to that licence.
- (6) A person is not entitled to a concession if they are not an ACT resident or if their vehicle is garaged at an interstate address.

6 Definitions

In this instrument:

BEV means a battery electric vehicle where the only means of propulsion for the vehicle is via an electric motor/s powered by a battery/ies that are recharged by plugging the vehicle into an electric power source external to the vehicle.

C means the level of concession mentioned in schedule 1, column 3 for the item.

CF means the concessional fee.

DF means the fee determined for a type of determined fee mentioned in schedule 1, column 4 for the item.

Full Licence see section 5 of the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2000.*

Gas powered means a vehicle that is designed or modified to use LPG (Liquid Petroleum Gas), CNG (compressed Natural Gas) or LNG (Liquid Natural Gas) in an internal combustion engine in the vehicle as its motive power.

HFCEV means a vehicle that is propelled by an electric motor/s powered by electricity generated by a hydrogen fuel cell, the vehicle carries hydrogen in tanks refuelled from external sources and does not have an internal combustion engine in the vehicle.

Hybrid means a vehicle powered by a combination of electric motor/s and an internal combustion engine and cannot be plugged into an external electric power source to recharge the batteries.

Old Provisional Licence means an old licence as prescribed by section 172 of the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2000*.

PHEV means a vehicle that is propelled by a combination of electric motor/s and/or an internal combustion engine that can operate together or separately and the battery/ies can be recharged by plugging the vehicle into an electric power source external to the vehicle.

P1 Licence means an ACT Provisional Licence subject to the P1 licence conditions prescribed by section 21 of the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing)* Regulation 2000.

P2 Licence means an ACT Provisional Licence subject to the P2 licence conditions prescribed by section 21 of the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing)* Regulation 2000.

Provisional Licence means an ACT provisional driver licence as prescribed by sections 24 and 25 and the Dictionary of the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2000*.

road transport legislation means the Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2000 and the Road Transport (Vehicle Registration) Regulation 2000.
