

<b>Colin Stewart Boardwalk</b>	Colin Sydmouth Stewart (1947–2019)	Architect, urban design  Colin Stewart studied architecture at the University of New South Wales graduating in 1970 with first class honours. He received a Byera Hadley Travelling Scholarship in 1971 and was awarded a Fulbright scholarship to Harvard University, completing a Master of City Planning in Urban Design in 1973. Following graduation, he worked in the office of Midtown Planning and Development in New York City and in 1974 he returned to Australia. He subsequently joined the staff of Sydney City Council as Chief Urban Designer. In 1981, Stewart was appointed to the National Capital Development Commission in Canberra. After establishing his own architectural practice in 1988, Stewart was joint winner in the National Design Competition for the Kingston Foreshore, Kingston in 1997. He was later commissioned to participate in Stage 2 of the design competition. Today, the scheme has been almost fully realised. Stewart's master plan extended the city to the water, defining and framing the lake edge and boat harbour built at Kingston. Stewart served two terms as ACT Chapter President of the Royal Australian Institute of Architects (RAIA). In 2007, he was appointed to the ACT Heritage Council, serving until 2011. Colin Stewart was awarded a Life Fellowship of the RAIA in 2010.
