APPOINTMENT OF TREATMENT ASSESSMENT PANELS

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

INSTRUMENT No's 265 - 277

The Drugs of Dependence Act 1989 provides for the establishment of Treatment Assessment Panels to assess clients referred from ACT Courts and to recommend treatment for these clients, where appropriate

Under Section 130 of the Act, it is a requirement of the Minister to appoint members of the Treatment Assessment Panel

Section 131 provides for the appointment of members of the Treatment Assessment Panel Section 133 provides for the appointment of presiding members of the Treatment Assessment Panel Section 134(1) provides for the appointment of an acting presiding member of the Treatment Assessment Panel

All appointees are current members of the Treatment Assessment Panel

Each Treatment Assessment Panel must comprise at least two experienced treatment workers and one legal practitioner
