EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The Chiropractors Registration Act 1983 (The Act) provides for the registration of persons engaged in the practice of chiropractic, and for related purposes.

This instrument revokes all existing determinations of fees payable under subsections 13(b) and 16(1)(b) of the Act and sets new fees which are indexed according to Consumer Price Index (CPI) increases.

1. Subsection 13(b) provides for a determined fee to be paid where a person has lodged an application with the ACT Chiropractic Board in accordance with section 12 of the Act for registration as a chiropractor.

The granting of registration by the Board where a person applies in accordance with section 12 is subject to the payment of that fee.

The current fee under subsection 13(b) is \$103.00 and the recommended increase for this fee is \$106.00.

2. Subsection 16(1)(b) provides for a requirement for a registered chiropractor to pay the determined fee on or before 1 September in each year.

Failure of a registered chiropractor to pay the annual fee will result in the Board cancelling the registration of that person under the provisions of subsection 16(4).

The current fee under subsection 16(1)(b) is \$103.00 and the recommended increase for this fee is \$106.00.
