Victims of Crime (Financial Assistance) Amendment Bill 2000 (No 2)

Overview

To implement a recommendation of the Standing Committee on Justice and Community Safety, the ACT Government has decided to increase the Victims of Crime Levy from \$30 to \$50.

This Bill gives effect to that decision.

Revenue/Cost Implications

The measure is estimated to increase revenue from the levy commensurate with the rise, ie. by almost 67 percent.

Victims of Crime (Financial Assistance) Amendment Bill 2000 (No 2)

Notes on Clauses

Name of Act

Clause 1 is a formal requirement. It refers to the title of the Act as the Victims of Crime (Financial Assistance) Amendment Act 2000.

Commencement

Clause 2 is a formal requirement. It refers to the commencement date of the Act as 1 July 2000.

Act amended

Clause 3 identifies the *Victims of Crime (Financial Assistance) Act 1983* as the Act amended.

Imposition of levy

Clause 4 amends section 68 by omitting subsection (1) and substituting a subsection which provides that when a person is convicted on or after 1 July 2000 of an offence to which Part V of the Act applies, that person is liable to pay a levy of \$50, regardless of when the offence was committed.
