Surveyors (Consequential Amendments) Bill 2000

Outline

The Surveyors Act 1967 has been reviewed under National Competition Policy principles and was found to be inflexible and too prescriptive. It is proposed that the existing legislation will be replaced by the Surveyors Bill 2000, which will implement a more modern, efficient and effective framework for survey practice in the Territory.

The Surveyors (Consequential Amendments) Bill 2000 (the Bill) repeals the Surveyors Act 1967 and the Surveyors (Examination and Registration) Regulations.

The Bill also makes formal consequential amendments to other legislation such as omitting references to the *Surveyors Act 1967*.

Financial Implications

Clause Notes

Clauses 1 and 2: Provide for the name and commencement of the Act. The Act will commence on the same day as section 5 of the *Surveyors Bill 2000*. That is, on a day fixed by the Minister by notice in the Gazette.

Clause 3: Repeals the Surveyors Act 1967 and the Surveyors (Examination and Registration) Regulations.

Clause 4: Provides for Schedule 1 of the Act.

Schedule 1: Lists each Act amended by the Bill and prescribes how specific Acts are amended.
