DECLARATION OF MANNER IN WHICH CERTAIN STOCK ARE TO BE IDENTIFIED

NO 4 OF 1992

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This instrument refers to section 11H(1) of the Stock Diseases Act 1933 and prescribes the manner in which stock subject to sale or slaughter should be identified.

In the case of cattle; how a tail tag should be applied in a manner to be clearly visible.

In the case of pigs 25 kg or over in weight; where and how a tattoo is to be applied. A tattoo must be applied 7 day or less prior to sale or slaughter to ensure that the tattoo remains legible.
