Court Procedures Regulation 2004

Outline

The *Crown Proceedings Act 1992* provides that the regulations may declare a law to be a ‘corresponding law’. The Act then binds the ACT to the ‘corresponding laws’. The *Crown Proceedings Regulation 1993* provide that the legislation governing crown proceedings in the Northern Territory, South Australia and Tasmania are declared to be ‘corresponding laws’.

The *Crown Proceedings Act 1992* has been consolidated into the *Court Procedures Act 2004*. To ensure that the ‘corresponding laws’ remain declared, this regulation remakes the *Crown Proceedings Regulation 1993*.

Section Notes

Section 1 – Name of regulation – provides that the regulation is the Court Procedures Regulation 2004.

Section 2 – Commencement – provides that the regulation commences on the day the *Court Procedures Act 2004* commences.

Section 3 – Notes – provides that notes included in the Regulation are only explanatory.

Section 4 – Corresponding law – Act, s20, def corresponding law – provides that the legislation governing crown proceedings in the Northern Territory, South Australia and Tasmania are declared to be ‘corresponding laws’.
