POISONS REGULATIONS (AMENDMENT)

1989 No. 5

The <u>Poisons Regulations</u> (Amendment) (the Amending Regulations) amend the <u>Poisons Regulations</u>. The amendment deletes references to 'narcotic drugs'. Those drugs are now regulated by the <u>Drugs of Dependence Ordinance 1989</u> which covers all matters previously dealt with by the <u>Poisons Regulations</u>.

Regulation 1 now changes a reference to the <u>Poisons and Dangerous Drugs</u> <u>Ordinance 1933</u> to its new name, the <u>Poisons Ordinance 1933</u>.

Regulation 2 deletes subregulation 4(2) which is only relevant to matters now covered by the <u>Drugs of Dependence Ordinance 1989</u>.

Regulations 3 and 4 remove references to 'narcotic drug' from Regulations 12 and 13 of the <u>Poisons Regulations</u>. As mentioned, these drugs are now covered by the <u>Drugs of Dependence Ordinance 1989</u>. Regulations 12 and 13 are also changed by the elimination of sexist references.

Regulation 5 repeals Regulations 16, 16A, 16B and 22 of the <u>Poisons Regulations</u>. These provisions previously dealt with the supply and the safekeeping of narcotic drugs. Those matters are now dealt with in the <u>Drugs of Dependence Ordinance</u> 1989.

Regulation 6 updates terminology in a form in the schedule to the <u>Poisons</u> Regulations.
