LIQUOR (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE 1982

NOS. 58 and 59, 1982

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The House of Assembly (Amendment) Ordinance 1982 (the amending Ordinance) amends the House of Assembly Ordinance 1936 (the Principal Ordinance) by abolishing the office of President of the Australian Capital Territory House of Assembly and creating in lieu the office of Speaker of the Australian Capital Territory House of Assembly. The amending Ordinance also provides for the election of the Speaker of the Australian Capital Territory House of Assembly at the first meeting of the House of Assembly after the commencement of the amending Ordinance. The Liquor (Amendment) Ordinance 1982 makes consequential amendments to the Liquor Ordinance 1975. Details of the Ordinances are as follows:

House of Assembly (Amendment) Ordinance 1982

Sections 1 and 2 deal with interpretation.

Sections 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 amend, respectively, sections 3, 6, 7, 9 and 14 and Schedule 1 of the Principal Ordinance by omitting "President" and substituting "Speaker" wherever occurring.

Section 9 is a transitional provision providing for the election of the Speaker of the Australian Capital Territory House of Assembly by the members of the Assembly at the first meeting of the Assembly held after the commencement of the amending Ordinance.

Liquor (Amendment) Ordinance 1982

Sections 1 and 2 deal with interpretation.

Sections 3 and 4 amend, respectively, sections 20 and 96 of the Liquor Ordinance 1975 by omitting "President" and substituting "Speaker" wherever occurring.
