**SEAT OF GOVERNMENT (ADMINISTRATION)
(AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE (NO. 4) 1982**

ORDINANCE NO. 73 OF 1982

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930 makes provision for the administration of the Ordinances of the Territory. The Seat of Government (Administration) (Amendment) Ordinance (No. 4) 1982 will enable Ministers other than the Minister for the Capital Territory to delegate powers conferred on them by any Ordinance. The Minister for the Capital Territory already has this power under section 12C of the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910. The proposed Ordinance will also add the Court of Petty Sessions (Civil Jurisdiction) Ordinance 1982 to the list of Ordinances administered by the Attorney-General. Details of the proposed Ordinance are set out below:

Section 1 cites the short title of the proposed Ordinance as the Seat of Government (Administration) (Amendment) Ordinance (No. 4) 1982.

Section 2 defines 'Principal Ordinance' for the purposes of the Ordinance as the Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930.

Section 3 inserts a new section 7 in the Principal Ordinance to empower a Minister other than the Minister for the Capital Territory to delegate to a person any of his powers under an Ordinance.

Section 4 adds the Court of Petty Sessions (Civil Jurisdiction) Ordinance 1982 to Part 1 of the Second Schedule to the Principal Ordinance, the list of Ordinances administered by the Attorney-General.
