HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY (REMUNERATION) ORDINANCE 1979

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

No. 12, 1979

The House of Assembly (Remuneration) Ordinance 1979 makes provision for the remuneration of members of the new Australian Capital Territory House of Assembly pending the issue of a determination in respect of those members under the Remuneration Tribunals Act 1973. A formal determination of the Remuneration Tribunal will not be issued until that Act is amended to reflect the change in title of the Assembly.

The Tribunal has considered the remuneration appropriate for members of the House of Assembly and the Chairman has indicated that, when the Tribunal's jurisdiction is clear, it would determine as follows:

President - a fee and an allowance at the rate of \$9,000 and \$1,250 per annum respectively; and

Members - fees and allowances at the rate of \$6,000 and \$750 per annum respectively.

Travelling allowance to be paid to all members at the same rate and conditions as apply to the holders of other part-time offices.

The House of Assembly (Remuneration) Ordinance 1979 provides for the remuneration of members at the levels advised by the Chairman of the Remuneration Tribunal.
