LIQUOR (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE (NO.3) 1979

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

ORDINANCE NO. 34 OF 1979

The Liquor (Amendment) Ordinance 1979 introduced a new section 34 which, among other things, precluded the renewal of a Club Licence on or after 1 June 1979 unless the applicant club, on the day preceding the date of application, had 200 members. This requirement created difficulties for several established ACT clubs.

The Liquor (Amendment) Ordinance (No.3) 1979 enables the Registrar of Liquor Licences to renew the licence of a club which held a Club Licence on the day immediately prior to the making of the Liquor (Amendment) Ordinance 1979 and the membership of which was not less than 150 on the day immediately prior to the day on which the application for renewal was made. Those clubs which were granted, or may in future be granted, a licence after the making of the Liquor (Amendment) Ordinance 1979 will be required to have 200 members as a condition of renewal.
