EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The *Canberra Institute of Technology Act 1987* governs the establishment, functions and membership of the Canberra Institute of Technology Advisory Council (the Council).

Section 31(2) of the Act enables the Minister to appoint members to the Advisory Council. It requires the Minister to ensure that there is always –

- a) 1 member who represents an organisation that represents the teaching staff;
- b) 1 member who represents the student body;
- c) 7 members who represent the interests of industry and commerce;
- d) 2 members, not representing the interest of industry or commerce, who have experience and knowledge relevant to the functions of the council;
- e) 1 member who has skills in and knowledge of vocational education and training.

The Minister for Education and Training, Andrew Barr MLA, has appointed Mr Craig Robertson as a member of the Council from the day after notification until 20 September 2013. Mr Robertson has been appointed as a member, not representing the interests of industry and commerce, who has experience and knowledge relevant to the functions of the Council (section 31(2)(d)). Mr Robertson is currently a member of the Council, appointed by Disallowable Instrument DI2009-251 under Section 31(2)(e), which was an error. Mr Robertson's current appointment expires on 20 September 2013. This instrument repeals and replaces DI2009-251, and covers the period up to the expiry of his current appointment.

The appointee is not public servant and this instrument makes an appointment to which the *Legislation Act 2001*, Division 19.3.3, applies. Accordingly, the instrument is a disallowable instrument under the *Legislation Act 2001*, section 229.

The Standing Committee on Education, Training and Youth Affairs has been consulted in accordance with section 228 (consultation with appropriate Assembly Committee) of the *Legislation Act* 2001.
