DECLARATION OF KINDS OF VEHICLE TO BE SEASONAL VEHICLES

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

A seasonal vehicle is defined in the *Road Transport (Vehicle Registration) Regulations* 2000 as:

A vehicle of a kind declared to be a seasonal vehicle under regulation 31 (Duration of registration) if the vehicle is used during part of the year only.

Seasonal vehicles are those which are included in the vehicle types declared to be seasonal vehicles, and which are used for part of the year only.

The purpose of this instrument is to declare certain kinds of vehicles to be 'seasonal' vehicles. Motorcycles, caravans, heavy vehicles and vehicles used in primary production are declared seasonal vehicles. These vehicle types tend to be used for part of the year only, either because they are built for a very specific purpose (e.g. earth-moving vehicles used for specific jobs) or because they are unsuitable for a particular time of year (e.g. motorbikes that are not used in winter).

The power to make this instrument is provided in subregulation 31(4) of the *Road Transport* (Vehicle Registration) Regulations 2000.

The declaration is a disallowable instrument pursuant to subregulation 31(5) of the *Road Transport (Vehicle Registration) Regulations 2000.*
