DETERMINATION OF NON-REFUNDABLE FEES
INSTRUMENT No. 313 OF 2000
EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Instrument has the effect of identifying, for the purpose of sub-regulation 14(3) of the *Road Transport (General) Regulations 2000* (the Regulations), the type of fees, charges or other amounts paid under the Road Transport Legislation that are 'non-refundable'.

Regulation 14 provides that the Road Transport Authority must refund fees, other than non-refundable amounts, when a person surrenders a driver licence, vehicle registration, driving instructors accreditation etc.

The fees described as 'non-refundable' in this instrument reflect the policy in force under the *Motor Traffic Act 1936* prior to the implementation of the Road Transport Legislation on 1 March 2000, except as provided for the Road Rescue Fee (RRF). A full refund of the Road Rescue Fee (RRF) will be allowed under this instrument where the operator surrenders registration before the start date of the registration period for which the RRF was paid.

This instrument will come into force on 1 October 2000.
