

# Medicines, Poisons and Therapeutic Goods (Fees) Determination 2022 (No 1)

## Disallowable Instrument DI2022-247

made under the

**Medicines, Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Act 2008, s 197 (Determination of fees)**

## EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

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The *Medicines, Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Act 2008* establishes an authorisation and licensing framework for medicines and poisons.

This instrument revokes and replaces DI2021-267, notified on 22 November 2021.

This instrument sets fees for the application of licences under the Act, as well as for the amendment or replacement of licences. The Determination comes into effect on 1 January 2023 and increases the fees by Wage Price Index of 3.25% (rounded to the nearest dollar), as set out below:
