EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

INSTRUMENT NO. 148 OF 2000 DETERMINATION

REMUNERATION TRIBUNAL ACT 1995

Legislative Context

The *Remuneration Tribunal Act 1995* (the Act) established the Remuneration Tribunal. The Tribunal may be constituted by the appointment of one member and may consist of not more than three members. Where more than one member is appointed, a member is appointed to be the chairperson.

The Chief Minister in accordance with section 20 of the Act may determine the fees and allowances payable to a member of the Remuneration Tribunal.

Background

The present rate of fees and allowances for members of the Remuneration Tribunal was last determined by the Chief Minister by instrument dated 15 April 1999.

That determination increased sitting fees.

Decision

This instrument changes the travel allowance to bring it into line with the travel entitlement of other ACT Public Office Holders. No other changes are made.

Financial Implications

The amounts of travel allowance determined fall within the amount set aside for this purpose.
