

# Health Records (Privacy and Access) (Fees) Determination 2023 (No 2)

## Disallowable instrument DI2023-259

made under the

Health Records (Privacy and Access) Act 1997, s 34

### EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

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This instrument revokes and replaces the Determination of Fees DI2023-31, notified on 27 March 2023.

This instrument comes into effect on 1 January 2024 and reproduces DI2023-31 except for:

- fees have increased by Wage Price Index of 3.75% (rounded);
- minor wording change to b(ii) from ‘secure encrypted email’ to ‘secure messaging’ to better reflect the delivery method; and
- the date of effect.

The fees schedule balances the importance of ensuring that fees are not a barrier to accessing health records with the need to ensure service providers receive reasonable reimbursement for the cost of providing access to the health records they hold.
